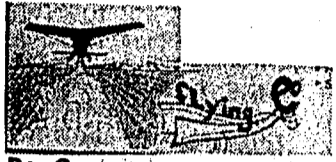

SECTION 1. The City of Juliaetta declares that it desires to qualify to receive aid for police training from the Law Enforcement Planning Commission under the provisions of Chapter 51, Section 19-5118, of the Idaho Code.
SECTION 2. Pursuant to Section 19-51117, of said Chapter 51, the City of Juliaetta, while receiving aid from the Law Enforcement Planning Commission pursuant to said Chapter 51, will adhere to the standards for employment and training established by the Idaho Peace Officers Standards and Training Advisory Council.
