PAUL CARSON

One of the pleasantest occupations NBC folk enjoy between programs is to stroll into B studio and find Paul Carson, organist, improvising at the console. An excellent conversationalist, Paul talks best while his fingers stray over the keyboard, losing floods of shimmering notes that are like brilliant, shaken plumage. Unconsciously, the Carson fingers make music that suits the mood of the talk—politics, art, an amusing bit of gossip—chatting with Carson, you are likely to hear anything and everything from "Destiny Waltz" to "Liebestod."

One of the west's best-known musicians, Carson was born in Bridgeport, Ill., and as his father was a clergyman he lived in

many cities as a child. He had his first music lessons from his mother on a small organ, and although his musical training has been extensive, the organ has remained his favorite medium.

Carson's "Bridge to Dreamland," heard Sunday nights at 10:15 p. m., P. S. T., has an army of faithful listeners up and down

NBC's Pacific Coast Red network. Carson is heard several other nights a week, and he also plays the "Destiny Waltz" which introduces "One Man's Family" on its twice-weekly broadcasts.

PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT STARTS NEW PROGRAM

President Franklin D. Roosevelt will inaugurate the 1936 "Mobilization for Human Needs"

campaign on Friday, November 6, over the combined networks of the National Broadcasting company and the Columbia Broadcasting system. The program will be the first of a series, Gerard Swope, chairman of the campaign, speaking from Cleveland, will introduce the president. Later in the program Mr. Swope, from the mobilization inaugural meeting, will second the president's plea for nationwide support of local charity and welfare organizations.

The broadcast will be carried

over the NBC-Red network from 7:00 to 7:30 p. m., P. S. T., and will open and close with selections by the Philadelphia orchestra, Leopold Stokowski conducting, from Philadelphia.

"DRUMS"

When a staid New England spinster turns detective and matches wits with a crafty oriental plotter on an island in the South Seas, who was?

That's one of the highlights of the current episode of "Drums," the William Farnum mystery-adventure serial broadcast over the Don Lee network from 8:00 to 8:30 p. m., Saturday, October 31.

In fact, it will be largely a night of detective work for "Drums." A second line of activity finds Philip Lawrence (Farnum) seeking the identity of the intruder who sought to steal the mysterious black pearl about which the plot currently is revolving.

Edwin C. Hill, who is heard as "The Spectator" Sundays over NBC, reads all the important American and foreign periodicals every day, gathering material for his broadcasts.
