The Kendrick Tigers and the Genesee Bulldog high school baseball teams met in a double header on the local diamonds Tuesday afternoon in seven-inning games.

The first game was a tie with score standing 14-14. In the second game Kendrick defeated Genesee 9-2.

**Completed Another Afghan**  
The Eastern Stars have completed and put together another Red Cross Afghan. The work was done at the home of Mrs. Bina Raby, it being completed last Wednesday.

**More "Smokejumpers" Hired**  
One hundred and fifty parachute fire fighters will be hired for smoke jumping in the northern region of the forest service, according to Clayton S. Crocker, in charge of fire control on the national forests of Montana, northern Idaho and eastern Washington.

"Recruitment of men for this special parachute-borne Forestry Service organization has been going on during the winter, but we have not so far, obtained enough applications from men qualified for the work," says Crocker. "Men between the ages of 18 and 30 who are physically fit, may apply. We like to get applications from college students because the seasonal nature of the work dovetails so well with the beginning and end of school sessions."

"Contrary to common belief, previous experience in parachute work is not necessary for smoke-jumpers. Younger men who have fought forest fire are at a premium, and too few of the present applicants have had this valuable experience. Men can be trained to jump in a month, but skill in fire suppression is acquired only by several seasons of actual work on fires."

"The rate of pay for smoke-jumpers is considerably higher than for most other seasonal Forestry Service jobs. Training will be done this year in two sessions, beginning May 15 and June 17, at the Ninemile training camp, 35 miles northwest of Missoula."

**Fewer Beans In Storage**  
Combined farm and commercial warehouse stocks of dry beans amounted to 626,000 bags on March 1 of this year, latest report date available. Dry pea stocks were 805,000 bags.

Disappearance of both beans and peas from stocks has been moderately heavy during the past three months. The March 1 stocks of beans are 558,000 bags less than on December 1, and the stocks of peas decreased 436,000 bags during the same period. Stocks of beans on March 1, 1945, amounted to 630,000 bags and pea stocks were considerably higher than this year at 1,390,000 bags.

As usual at this season in Idaho, farm stocks are low, but they are also lower than last year. Dry peas on farm amounted to only 18,000 bags against 58,000 in 1945. On December 1, dry peas amounted to 94,000 bags.

Commercial warehouse stocks of Great Northern beans, the state's most important variety, was 407,000 bags, seven thousands bags more than holdings a year earlier. Stocks of pinto and other varieties were less than last year, while reds were higher. Other varieties, chiefly garden seed, amounted to 116,000 bushels, 15,000 bushels less than last year.

Heaviest increase in stocks of dry peas was in the edible types. Last March 1, stocks of wrinkled varieties totaled 403,000 bags; current stocks are 333,000 bags.



### Oh, You Butter!

The U. S. department of agriculture announces that producers of creamery butter will be required to set aside 20 percent of their May production for sale to military agencies. This action was taken to enable the army, navy and other war service agencies to purchase butter at this time. No butter will be set aside for export shipment to foreign countries.

Military agencies expect to purchase about 45 million pounds of butter from U. S. supplies during 1946, and it is now planned to operate the set-aside program only during May and June, when production is seasonally largest.

On the basis of tentative estimates, supplies of creamery butter for civilian use during May are considerably more than has been available during recent months.

Secretary of Agriculture Anderson says that our top job, now, will be to supply our share of the food for the hungry populations of the world. He adds: "All of us share in the responsibility — the farmers to produce and industry and individual families to save and share. We must not fail. Too much is at stake."

Well, he missed adding that industry, too should produce. Farmers must have machinery, tractors, trucks, etc. They can't raise food with "drawing board plans." — And then, the strikers must eat, also!

### War Training Dividends

It is encouraging to note that the interest shown by many industrial firms for men and women in service, as evidenced over and over again by gifts, correspondence and other means, is not being put on the shelf now that the war is over.

Just one example of this attitude is the hand now being held out by General Motors to some 17,000 boys — not many of them even former GM employees — who at one time or another, while in uniform, had mechanical training in the company's shops and plants. On their discharge from service they have been getting letters from GM, asking whether they are interested in work in a dealer's service department, thereby utilizing that wartime training, and whether GM can be of aid in placing them. More than 3,400 of them have taken the company up so far.

This service, as an intermediary, is a practical and sensible one. There is much of the basic skill learned for war than can be turned to good account in peace.

Three cheers for any activity that can bring the skill and the job properly together — and help get things rolling again.
