#### About G. I. Loans

Veterans wanting to obtain G. I. loans should go directly to a bank, savings and loan association or other lending agency, Ross L. Rowe, contact representative for the Veterans Administration in Moscow, states. They should not apply to the V. A. for the loan.

The following points of advice will save the veteran a lot of time and effort in obtaining a loan, whether it is for the purpose of building a home, establishing a business, or buying a farm:

1. Don't rush into any venture; have definite plans formulated.
2. Contact a lending agency, which will process the case through the V. A.; the V. A. does not make the loan. It only guarantees the bank a certain portion of the loan.
3. Submit original discharge papers or original separation papers to the lending agency at the time of applying for a loan in order to establish eligibility for loan guarantee and to facilitate endorsement of the papers by the V. A.

At the end of May a total of 350 G. I. loans valued at \$1,000,000 had been approved for veterans in the state of Idaho.

#### Package Frozen Food Correctly

Because it is inadvisable to re-freeze foods once thawed, containers for home-freezing should be selected with the size of the family in mind. A recently published guide recommends a pint carton for three large servings of most vegetables; a quart container for five or six generous servings. Larger containers are not recommended for average-size families, for not only do they tend to be wasteful of room, but of storage space.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 255

AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING A LICENSE FEE UPON EACH COIN OPERATED AMUSEMENT DEVICE LICENSED BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT AMUSEMENT DEVICE CONTROL ACT, OPERATED WITHIN ANY PLACE OF BUSINESS WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE VILLAGE OF KENDRICK, LATAH COUNTY, IDAHO.

Section No. 1. The Clerk is hereby authorized to issue a License to any place of business operating within the Corporate Limits of the Village of Kendrick, Latah County, Idaho, for the operation of a coin operated amusement device upon the application thereof by any business place, and upon the payment of a License Fee of \$50.00 per machine, per year.

No License will be issued to any applicant until said applicant exhibits to the Village Clerk the required license issued by the Federal Government for such coin operated machine for the year in which said application for license is made.

Section No. 2. All licenses shall become due the 1st day of July each year, or upon the commencing of business.

In the former case the tax shall be computed for 1 year. In the latter case it shall be computed on the first day of the month in which liability for license is commenced, and to and including the 30th day of June following.

Section No. 3. This license applies to all coin operated amusement devices with the exception of Music Boxes operated within the Corporate Limits of the Village of Kendrick, Latah County, Idaho.

Section No. 4. No coin operated amusement devices shall be licensed to or operated by any person, corporation or club within the Corporate Limits of the Village of Kendrick, Latah County, Idaho, unless said machines are licensed by the Federal Government.
