The drivers of both cars were not hurt, as the speeds were slow.

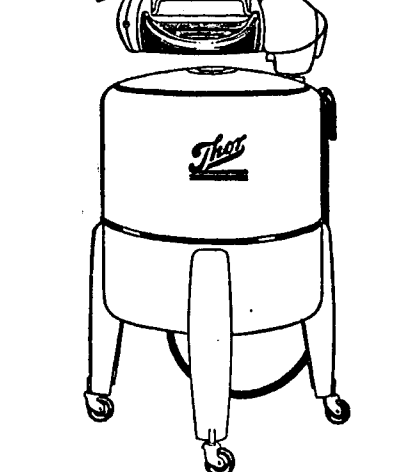

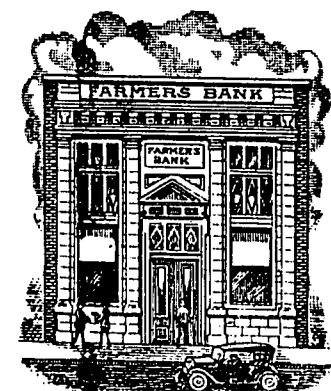

**Textile Display At University**  
 What the well-dressed woman of 1958 may wear will be on display at the Northwest Textile Conference to be held at the University of Idaho June 28 to July 1.

"We can't predict whether skirts will be longer or shorter in 1958," said Dr. Simon Williams, textile authority from Massachusetts, who will direct the conference, "but we can safely say that there will be many new fabrics. Scientists are now working overtime to turn them out." Research oddities to be display in the northwest for the first time at the conference include a piece of fabric that is half wool and half glass. Then there are others that combine redwood bark with wool, and soybean with wool.

"These have just emerged from the test tubes and are not on the commercial market," said Dr. Williams, "but rayon was in this same stage of development only a few years ago." Thousands of new commercial fabric samples have also been shipped from the east for display at the conference. There are fabrics using non-tarnishing, washable metallic yarn. There are gingham that a woman would like to whip into an evening gown. Exemplifying the height of blending, is a fabric containing wool, cotton, nylon, mohair, rayon and peanut fiber.

"No blends will ever replace the all-wool overcoat or the cotton sheet," predicted Dr. Williams, "but in most lines of fabrics blending opens new color, style and quality possibilities." Among those expected to attend the conference, first of its kind in the Pacific Northwest, are manufacturers, wholesalers and retailers, wool and flax growers, home economists — and housewives.

**Safety Will Pay Off!**  
 Be alive on the Fifth. That is the advice being offered to motorists by the Idaho state safety director's office.

Many persons who start out to celebrate the Fourth of July this year won't come back — if the holiday accident toll runs true to form. "The Fourth of July usually is the summer's most dangerous holiday, and this year promises to be no exception," said George Vaughn, director. "A three-day holiday, an upward trend in vehicle mileage, prosperous times — all these add up to a big celebration and a huge toll of dead and injured unless we all make it our business to do something about it."

 Boise — A conference of medical members of the board of directors of the American Cancer Society will be held in Sun Valley on July 6 in conjunction with the annual meeting of the Idaho State Medical Assn., Dr. Alfred M. Pompa of Boise, says. To be considered by the group will be the 1948-49 service program for cancer patients in the state; selection of 30 Idaho physicians to attend the cancer refresher course at the University of Oregon Medical school in Portland, in September, and a report on activities of the cancer organization during the past year.
