Appointed To Managership
 The Washington Water Power Co. this week named Victor S. Casebolt, district manager at Colfax since 1936, as new manager for the Moscow district and successor to J. Harry Lucas, who last week was promoted as Lewiston division manager for the company. Announcement of Mr. Casebolt's transfer was made by J. E. E. Royer, vice president and general manager, Spokane. The new manager will assume his duties in Moscow in a short time. Mr. Royer said Mr. Casebolt has an excellent service record with the company, and has always proved an

outstanding manager. He was first employed by W. W. P. in 1921, joining the company as a part-time construction helper and general service man in his home town of Genesee while completing high school there. During the summer of 1923 he became acting manager for the company at Uniontown, leaving that fall for study at the U. of I.

He rejoined the company in 1924 and was sent to Wilbur as a stores clerk, later doing line work including foremanship of a line crew. In 1927 he was transferred to Kendrick as general service man and successively was manager at Bovill and Rosalia. Mr. Casebolt became district manager for the company in the Tekoa area in 1931, and in 1936 took over duties as Colfax district manager. During his 12 year stay in Colfax he attained high regard in the community, engaging in many civic affairs. He is past president of the Colfax Chamber of Commerce and the Kiwanis club. He has also been active in Boy Scout work. During World War II he chairmanned Whitman county's highly successful scrap drive, and was a member of the area's draft board.

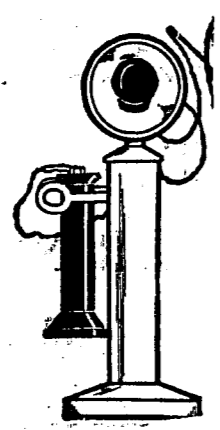
