In order to obtain the most efficient service from the postal de-partment, the public is urged to observe the following rules, says

Address all mail plainly in ink. giving street, box or rural number and delivery zone.

Place return address in the upper front porch off the Community left hand corner of envelope or

Put address only on one side of package.

Do not seal package unless it bears the sticker: "Contents, merchandise — Postmaster, This parcel may be opened for postal inspection if necessary."

Do not send perishable matter during the Christmas rush. Do not enclose letters in parcels.

Christmas seals should not be placed on the address side of mail.

It is permissable to write on the outside of a package: "Do not open until Christmas.'
