The hard-fighting Cubs double-checked the local quintet and held them to an "even-Stephen" throughout the game. Kamiah led 16-13 at the end of the first period, but the Tigers slowly fought their way to a 31-29 lead at half-time. The lead again shifted and Kamiah held a 1-point margin until early in the fourth quarter, when Kendrick snapped into a 3-point lead. Kamiah, still set on winning the game, slowly moved to a 48-45 decision at the gun.

In the preliminary game the Kendrick B squad slaughtered the Kamiah Bs, 65-44. Coach Racicot substituted freely, but still the local team romped on. Walter Wolff led the Tigers with 18 points; Axtel led Kamiah with 22.

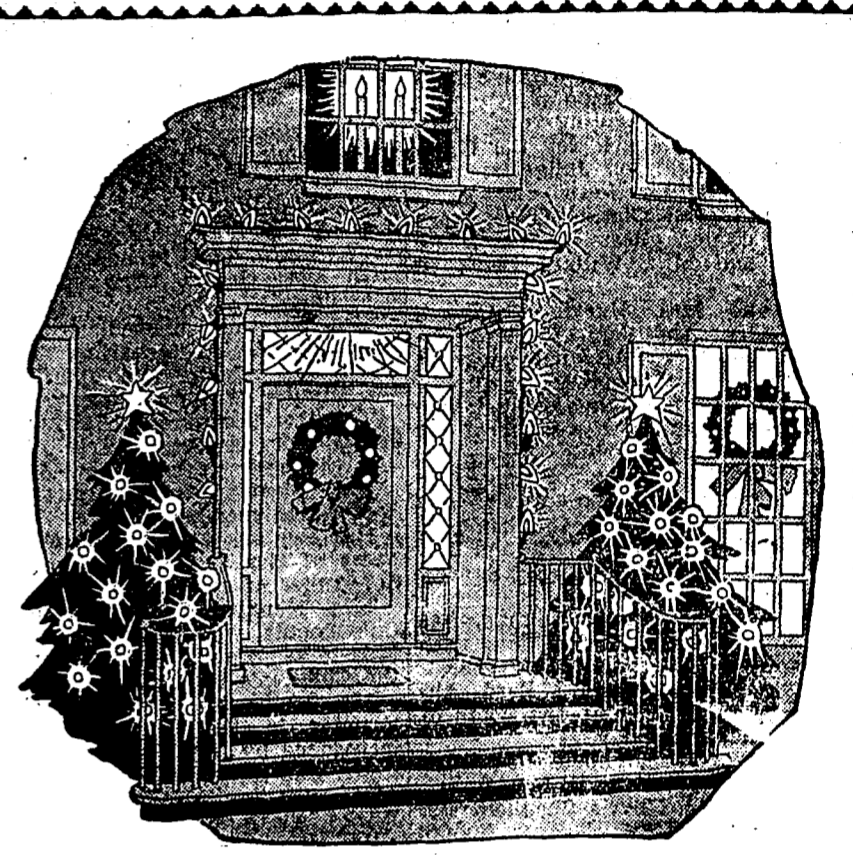

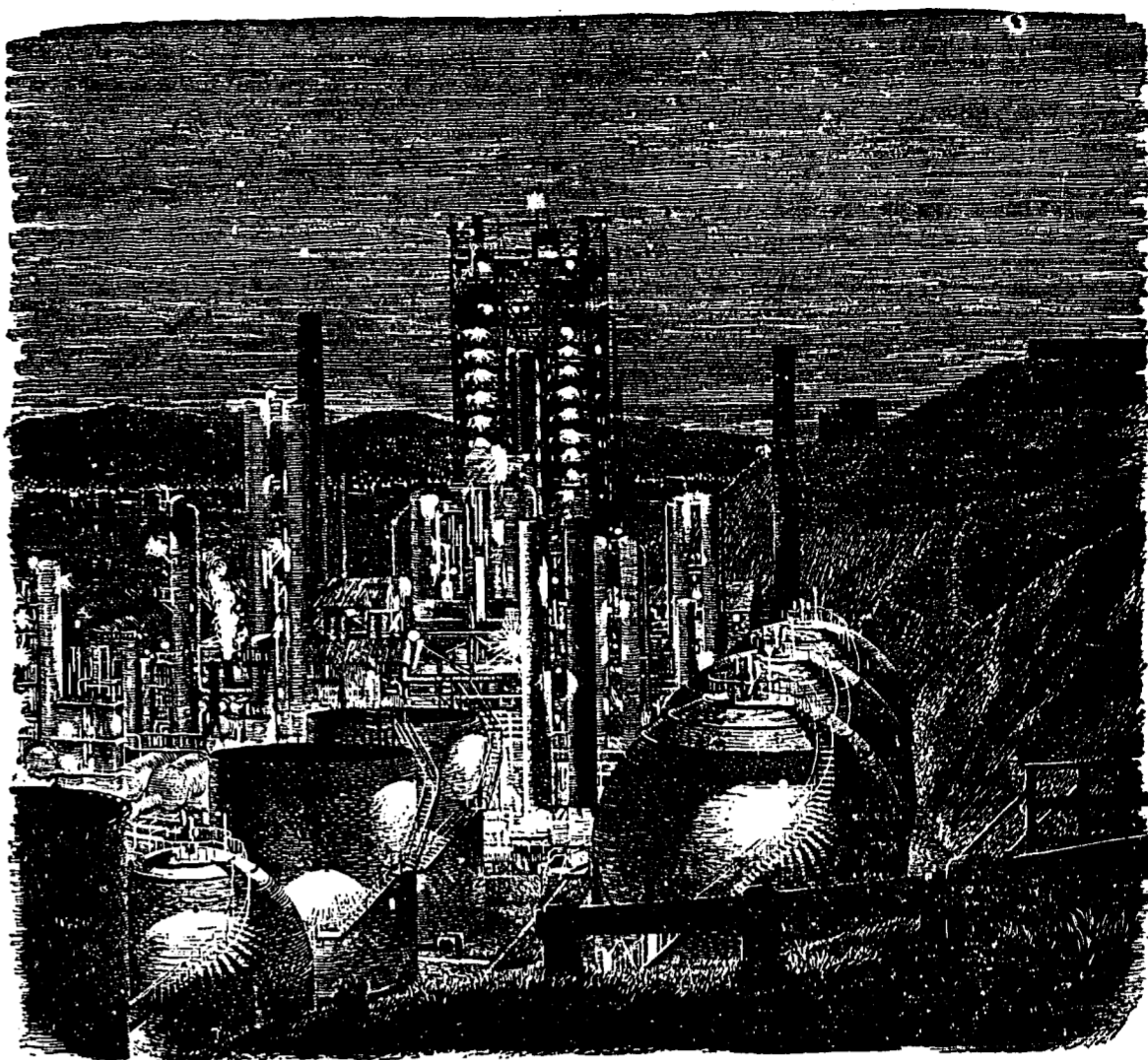



### A BIT OF IDAHO HISTORY

Within a month a new governor, duly elected by the people, will be inaugurated in Boise, and for four years will be the state's chief administrator. But it was a different matter back in Idaho's days as a territory.

Citizens of a territory had no choice in the selection of their governor; he was appointed by the President of the United States; President Abraham Lincoln appointed the first one, William Wallace, and Wallace selected Lewiston as the state capital. A year later, Caleb Lyons of Lyonsdale, New York, was appointed governor of Idaho territory to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Governor Wallace, who had been elected Delegate to Congress at the preceding election. But Governor Lyons did not arrive in Idaho to assume the duties of his office for several months after his appointment.

In fact, there were often long stretches of time when the Territory had no chief executive. Whoever was president at the time had difficulty in finding a man who would "go out west to Idaho" to be governor. Some of these men, like Gilman Marston, never appeared at all, having "got lost or stolen on the way out." Alexander H. Conner, from nobody knows where, was next appointed but for some reason he, too, failed to appear.

It is reported that President Ulysses S. Grant grew rather impatient over the vanishing of his appointees and finally insisted that the next one actually reach the Territory and look around. The next one did come to Idaho to look around. Within a week, however, he shook the dust of Idaho from his shoes and disappeared.

One governor stayed a while, and Hawley's history records that David W. Ballard was a good-natured sort of fellow "who drew his salary with commendable regularity and did little else to inform people that he held high office or was alive at all."

In time Idaho Territory settled down a little as rowdy scoundrels were replaced with more substantial and law-abiding citizens. And in 1890 Idaho became a state.

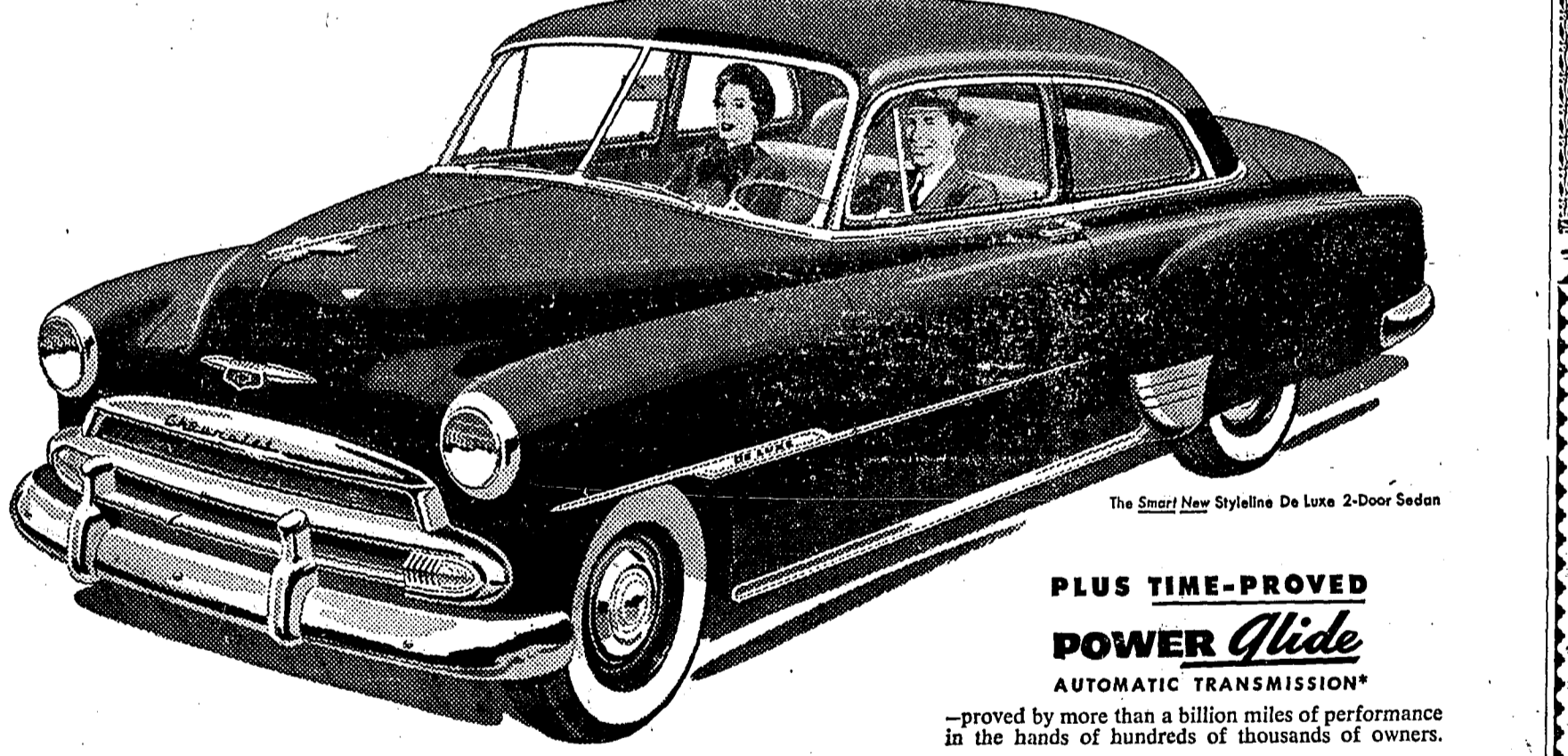

**C. C. Y. Meeting**

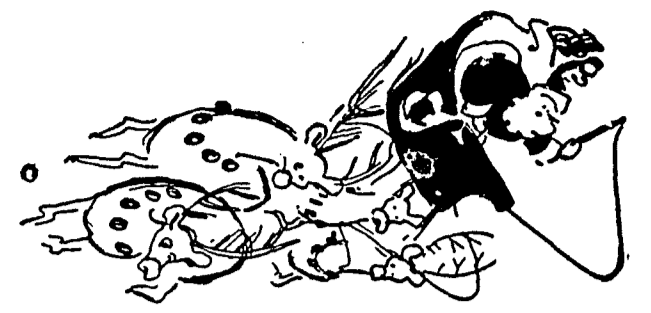

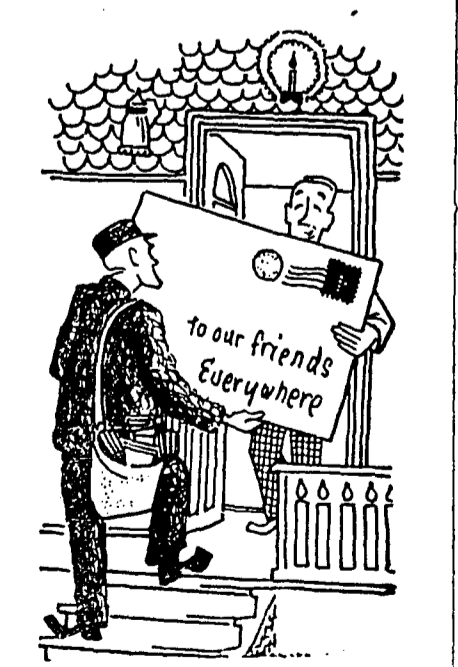

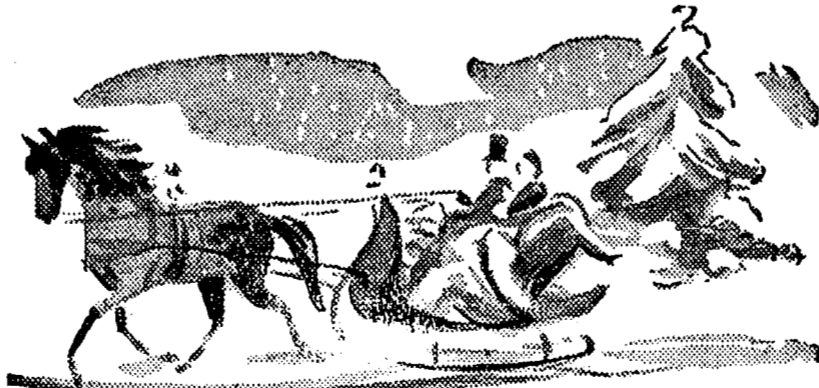
