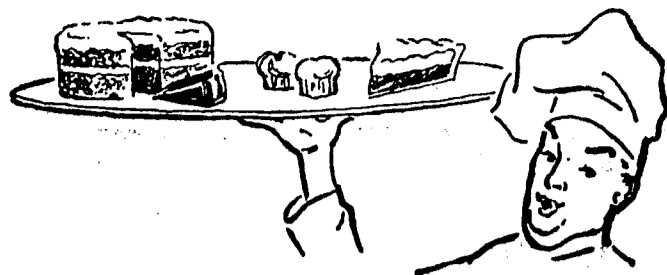




**Roads Slowly Drying Up**

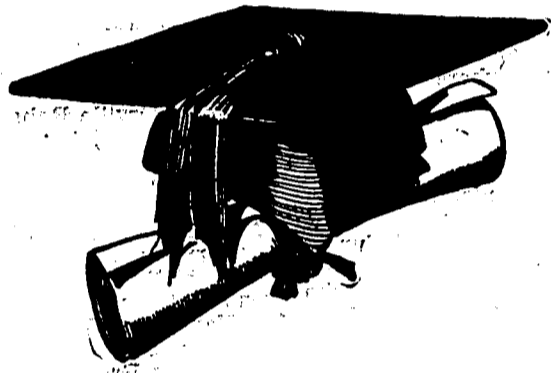
spring comes and the hill can again be sloped off.

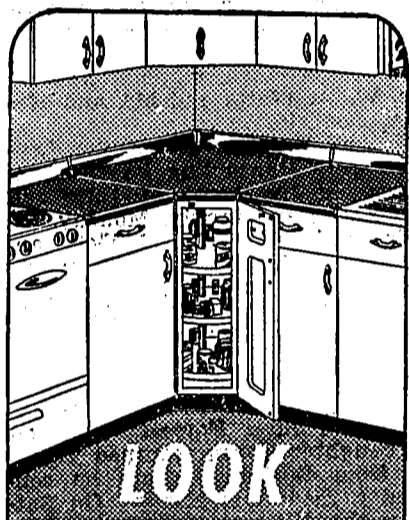

**Don't Kill Those Swallows**  
U. of I. Moscow — Any farmer who destroys a colony of swallows — barn or cliff — actually is killing some of his best friends, declares Thomas D. Burleigh, bird specialist with the U. S. Fish and Wildlife service, stationed at the university.  
On his field trips last summer, gathering data for a book on the birds of Idaho, Burleigh noted a general anti-swallow sentiment among Idaho farmers. It traces to a belief that swallows nesting around barns bring in bedbugs.  
"Swallows feed on the wing and eat every kind of flying insect from gnats to grasshoppers," Burleigh declares. "There is no known case of a swallow bringing in bedbugs, because bedbugs don't fly."

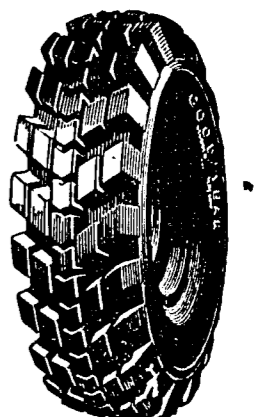
