The Langdons were among the early pioneers, coming there in 1886 before there was a town of Kendrick or even a road up to the ridge.

They spent over 30 years on their farm, except for the two years Mr. Langdon was Assessor and Tax Collector of Latah County in 1902 and 1903. They moved from the ranch to Lewiston Orchards, from there to Juliaetta, then in 1924 moved to Los Angeles, where they have resided ever since. They are 92 and 89 years of age, and not very well, but look forward each Monday to receiving the Kendrick Gazette, to hear some news from their old friends or their families.

Their house was decorated with over a hundred greeting cards received from relatives and friends, along with many beautiful potted plants and flowers.
