"As a matter of fair play I find it difficult to comprehend why the people of Tupelo, Mis-sissippi, and Nashville, Tenn., (TVA consumers) should enjoy all the benefits of tax-free electric energy while my Vir-ginia neighbors and I, and many others pay electric rates which properly reflect the sub-stantial local, state and Federal taxes, paid by the investorowned companies.'

TVA pays nothing in federal taxes, and only relatively small sums in lieu of taxes to other agencies of government. It pays no interest on its huge invest-ment of taxpayers' money. That explains why TVA power
