**HOW TO USE WIRE SOLDER SAFELY**



This will save many a burned finger when using a soldering iron. A handle wound from wire itself will prevent wire solder from becoming too hot to hold. Wrap a suitable length, 2 or 3 ft., around a pencil, then pull off the coils. Pass one end of the wire through the center of the turns. The solder now can be held around the loops and worked close to the torch or iron without danger of burned fingers. Additional solder is supplied by pulling the end through the coils.

### Preparing An Animal For Show

When getting a steer ready for a show it is better to train it a few minutes each day than several hours once a week.

That's the advice from Jim Hurd, assistant county agent, to 4-H Club members. Beef showmanship suggestions are on hand in the county agent's office.

Your animal should be trained, he said, to lead easily, to walk with head up, to stop at your command, and to stand quietly with his feet set squarely under him. Get your animal used to other animals, crowds and noises.

Regular feeding and fresh water are important in fitting. In summer it's best to keep the animal in the shade during the day and out at night. Beef animals should be washed at least once a month prior to a show — but not more than once a week. Rinse the hair thoroughly to remove the soap, and curl after each washing.

Hurst also had some tips on clipping. Do not clip the head of a horned calf, he said. Clip the heads of smooth dehorned and polled animals to a point about the width of a halter strap back of the ears. This clipping should be done approximately a week before showing. Usually the ears are not clipped. Just remove any long or discolored hair. Do not clip the eyelashes, the hair inside the ears, or the long hair around the muzzle. Clip the tail from even with the depth of the twist to the tailhead. Blend tailhead smoothly with rump.

Trim the feet so they set firmly on the ground. This should be done at least two or three weeks ahead of showing in order to avoid tenderness. Clean the hooves before entering the ring.

When leading a calf hold the lead-strap in the right hand and the show stick in the left. Be sure the lead-strap comes out the left side.

Be alert. Keep your attention on the two most important things — the judge and your calf.

### Fire Hazard Increasing Daily

Henry Jones, deputy state fire warden at Kendrick, says that the fire hazard is increasing greatly with every warm day — and he warns fishermen, campers, picnickers, loggers, farmers, etc., to use extreme caution at all times.

He also asks that should a fire occur that no time be lost in notifying the office here. Speed is important.

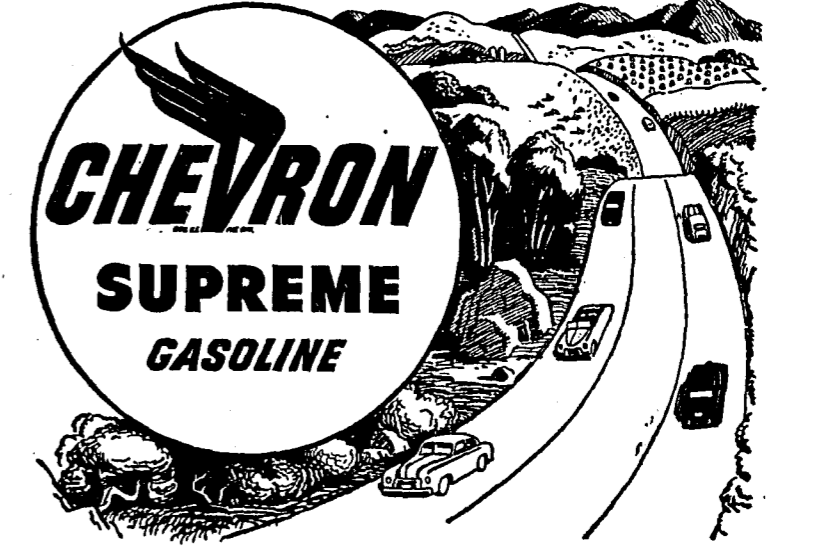
