First on the job were Bob Meserve and Ward Helton, who attempted to put out the blaze with a fire extinguisher bomb and CO-2 extinguisher — but found their chemical supply inadequate.

Bill was draining the gasoline from the pickup tank to clean it of moisture, and in some manner the gasoline ignited, enveloping the pickup in flames and also setting fire to his car, parked close by.

Damage to the pickup was estimated at \$150.00 by members of the fire department. No estimate was made to that of the car, which was mainly scorched paint.


