





**SWEATERS**

When washing orlon sweaters, remember the material is "thermo-plastic." That means it is sensitive to high temperature. The wash water should be lukewarm — about 70 degrees — says Ruth Shane, county home agent.

Use any non-alkaline detergent, or soap, and a water softener. Give orlon sweaters the same care you would other fine fabrics, the home agent advises. Turn sweaters in-

side out when you wash them. Use enough detergent to remove all soil. Never wash white or light sweaters with darker sweaters.

If you use a water softener and soap be sure to put water softener in the rinse water, too. This helps to remove all the soap. Rinse the sweater thoroughly. In the last rinse use any of several fabric softeners to reduce static electricity.

Roll the sweater in a towel to remove moisture. If the sweater is a cardigan type, button it and shape on a towel to dry.

**OUTDOOR LIGHTING**

Backyards and front lawns are rapidly being made into nighttime spots of beauty and recreation by modern homemakers using outdoor lighting.

The most commonly used outdoor fixtures are post lights, flood lamps, and spotlights in various styles and designs.

"Driveway entrances, door ways, and various spots on the lawn or garden are good locations for post lights," according to Loris A. Winn, Moscow District Manager for Washington Water Power Company.

"For those who desire portable lights, a post light with a spike which can be driven into the ground is available."

Flood lamps and spot-lights can be used for numerous purposes. They can be mounted on the house, on the ground, or in a tree to transform summer lawns, trees, and flower beds into an attractive night time area.

Dramatic shadows can be created on the side of the home by concealing spotlights or flood lamps in shrubbery, and directing their light upward through the foliage.

Small statues or trees can be attractively accented by aiming concealed spotlights, toward them.

A tree can be given a giant lighted umbrella effect by hiding a flood lamp in an upturned position in the trunk crotch. The light-colored foliage will reflect light softly downward.

In addition to these decorative effects, lighting fixtures can be placed over barbecue pits, tables, shuffleboard courts, work benches, and other areas for outdoor recreation at night," Winn said.

Outdoor lighting also serves to reduce accident hazards along paths and steps, and discourages prowlers from disturbing the home.

By choosing inexpensive waterproof fixtures, an excellent installation can be made for as little as \$30 or \$40.

Fifteen to \$25 will buy enough equipment for good temporary outdoor party lighting.

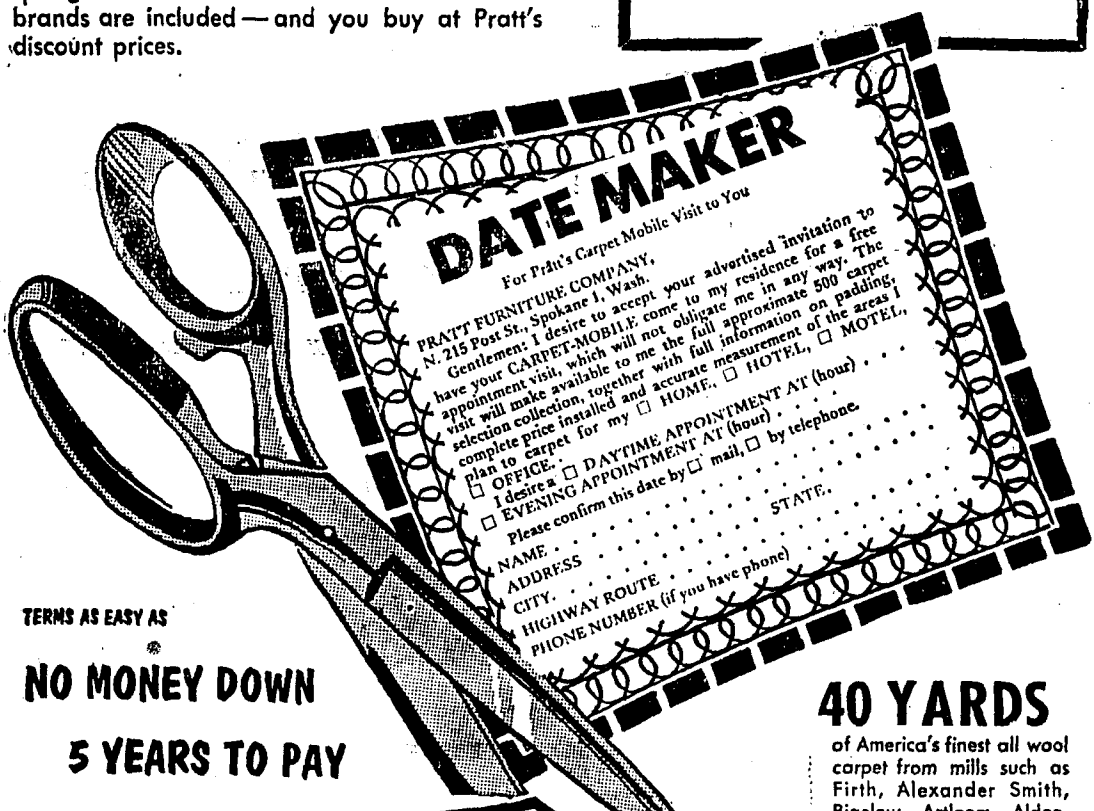

HELPING NATURE take its course, these Fish and Game department workers are using a tractor-drawn, dual rotary blade chopper to make clearings for sage grouse "booming ground." Such clearings in the sage brush soon will see dawn-parading males ceremoniously strutting like turkeys. With tails and wings spread, silver-white capes covering shoulders and breasts, male sage grouse emit high-noted "popping" or booming sounds until the

hens drift in and the mating parade proceeds. Males are nearly twice as big as the hens and have air sacks which are inflated to serve as sounding boards for the peculiar booming noises.

Making sage grouse censuses is no snap because biologists frequently must ditch camp and spend chilly nights on the desert near booming grounds before sunrise ceremonial parades begin — so the counts can be made.

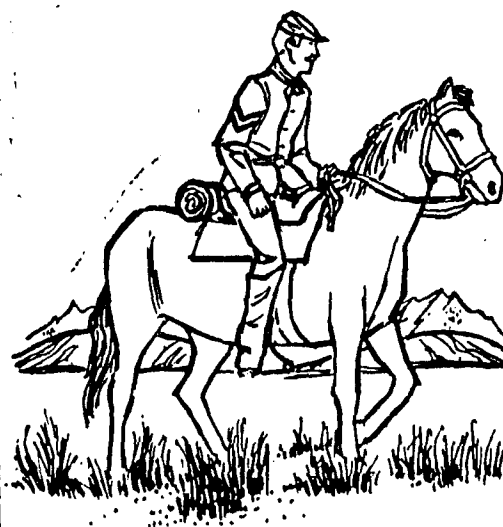
