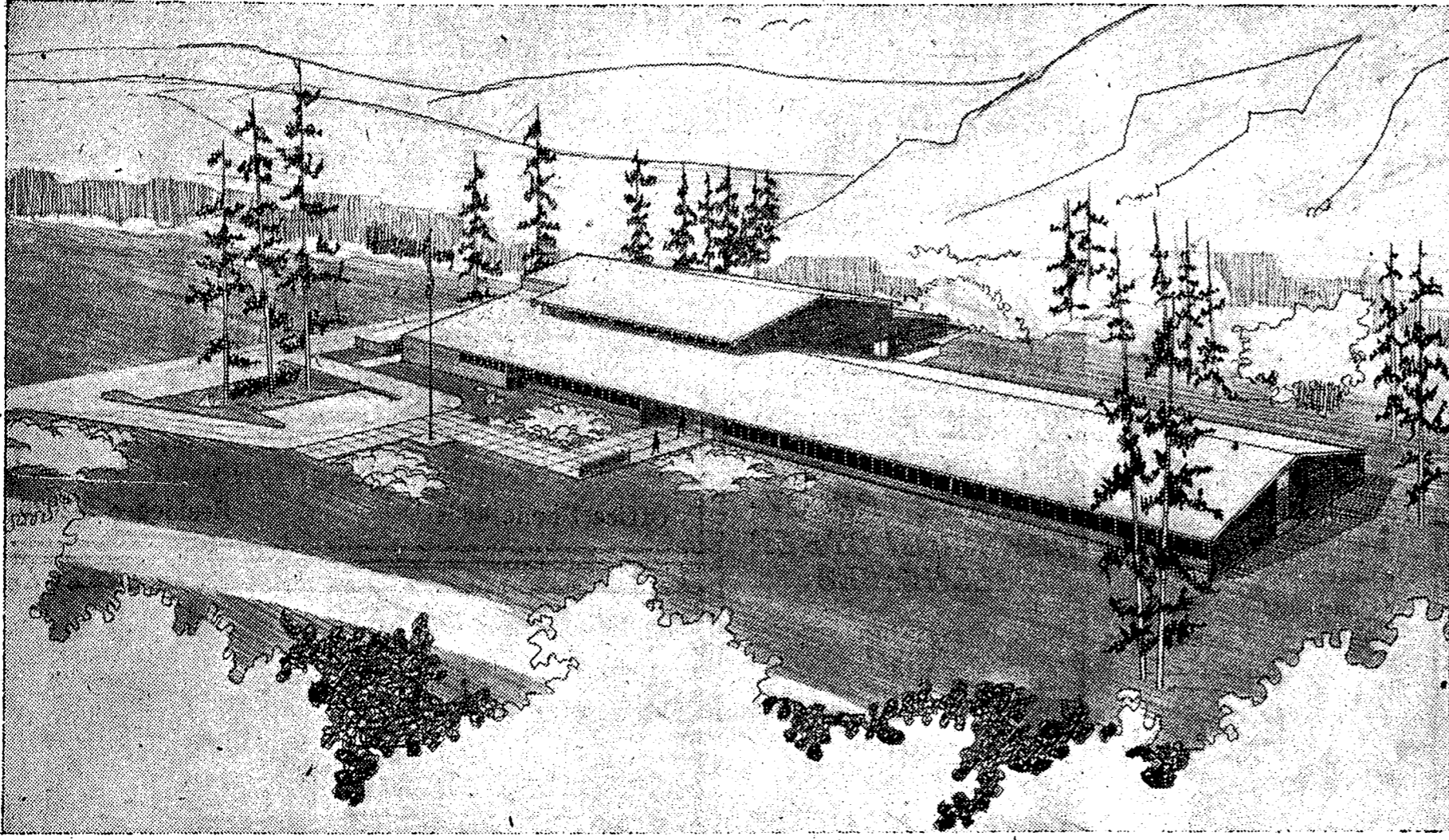






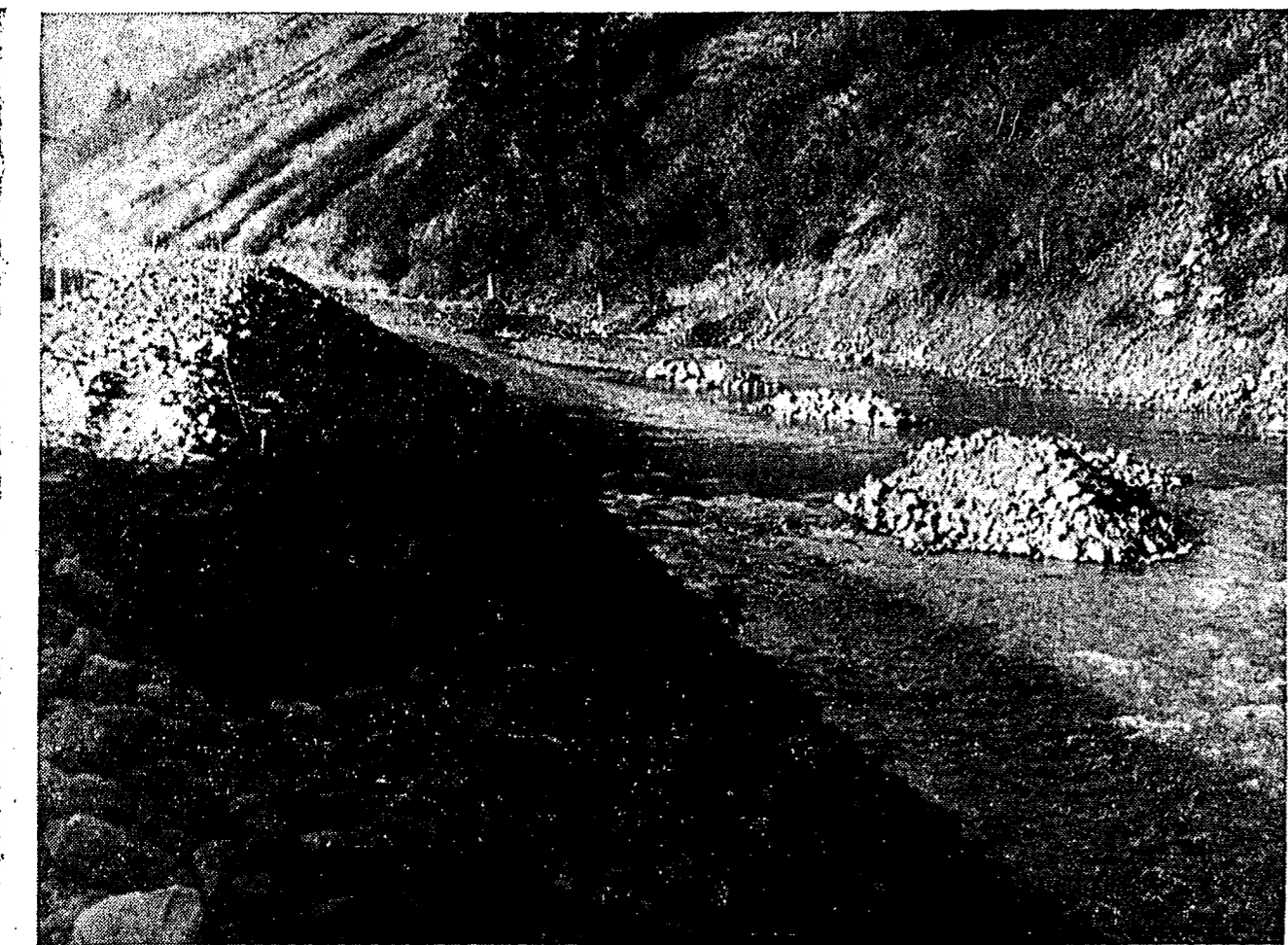

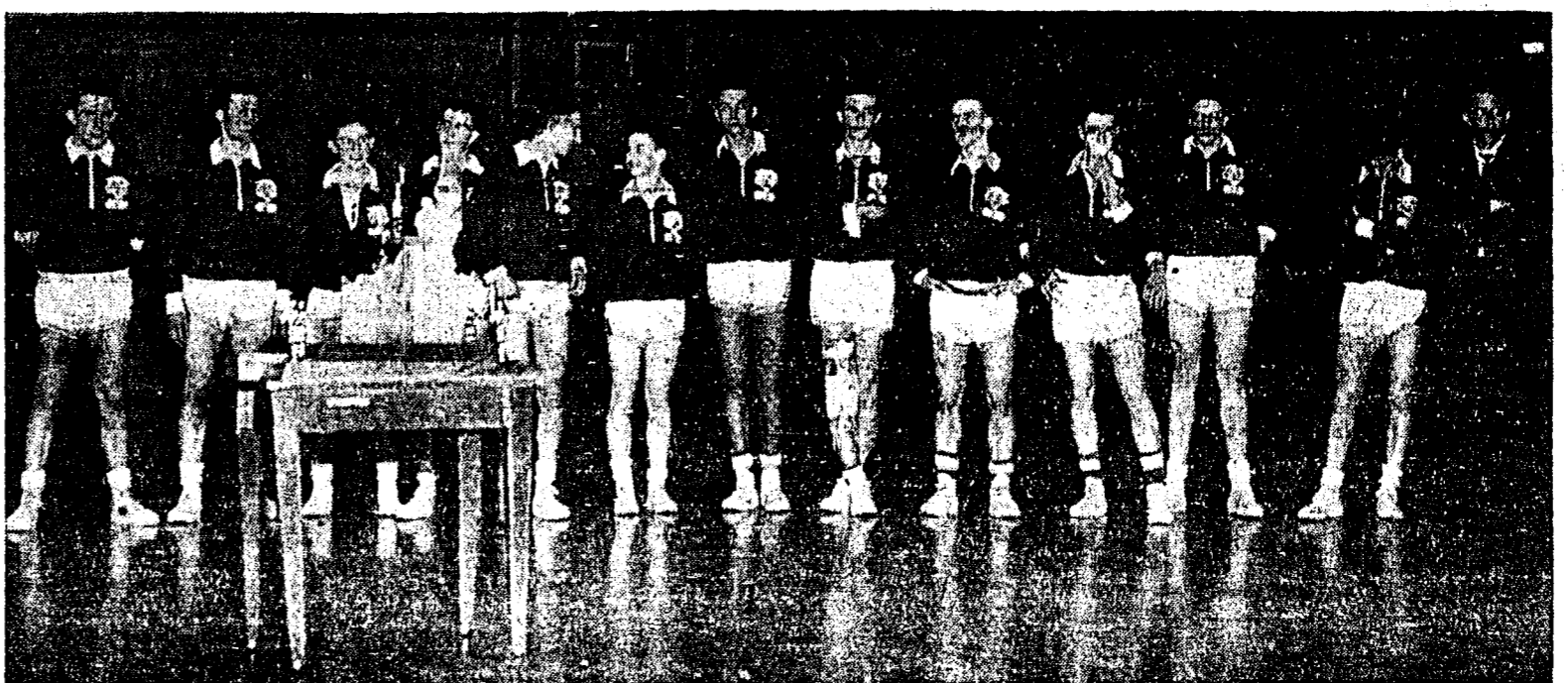

### LOCAL HIGHWAY PROJECT FOR '60

Only one new highway contract of a local nature is on the schedule for 1960, according to a list of projects just released from Boise. This project is the surfacing of 9.5 miles of State Highway 7 between Ahsahka and Cavendish.

Other work, of course, will be done in the area, but it is a carry-over from the 1959 program, part of which was halted last fall by lack of federal aid appropriations, and part by inclement weather.

The State Highway Department reported Wednesday of last week that Idaho roads to be built during 1960 were largely planned for 1959, but had to be held over because of the financial crisis.

The department released details of a road program costing \$33 million from combined sources. This was \$6,100,000 less than the amount spent on all Idaho highway systems in 1958, the highest construction year.

The state had planned a \$40 million program in 1959 but it was cut below \$20 million when the federal highway trust fund, which provides the greater amount of the money, ran out.

Most of the inter-state highway funds have been marked for projects in eastern Idaho so that the major route between Pocatello and Idaho Falls can be finished as soon as possible, the department said.

"This particular section, together with the interstate location across north Idaho (the Lewis & Clark Highway), are considered to constitute the most critically deficient sections of state highway systems which now exist," said the department in its statement.

The 1960 program planned by the state board of highway directors amounts to \$28,375,000 for road construction contracts, engineering work and acquisition of needed right-of-way.

About 80 percent of this, or \$22,899,000 will consist of federal aid funds and the remainder, or \$5,736,

000 consists of state matching dollars. The highway department said adjustments may be necessary in the second half of 1960, since federal reimbursement plans have been made only for the first half.

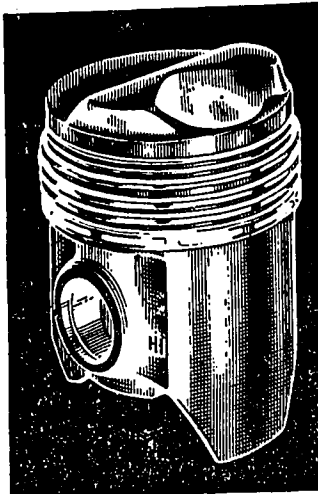
