GOVERNMENT CASH

Wash., D. C. — The U. S. Army Engineers let 27 contracts in Idaho last year for a total of \$48,900,000 in construction projects, Sen. Henry C. Dworshak says.

The projects included a small portion of the Titan base at Mountain Home Air base and emergency flood control work on various Idaho rivers and studies for future projects.

Work on the South Fork of the Boise river between Pine and Feathererville was completed. Construction is slated to begin in February on Lawyers Creek near Kamiah.

Other projects include Blackfoot, where a hearing is slated this month on formation of a Flood Control District; completion of a \$60,000 project near Kendrick on the Potlatch river; design studies under way for the Weiser river project, etc.

Paul H. Symbol, district engineer for the corps, said work at Mountain Home has just begun, and that the current year will see \$155 million in Northwest projects, one of the largest engineering budgets in history.

U. of I., Moscow — Full membership in the National Association of Schools of Music has been granted to the University of Idaho Department of Music, it was announced this week.

The university will join 250 leading schools and conservatories of music in the United States who are members of the association, oldest such group concerned with college-level standards of teaching music.

"We are most pleased to hear of our election to full membership as the association is the only accrediting agency in the college music field," said Prof. Hall M. Macklin, head of the music department.

The University of Idaho was elected to associate membership in 1956. Full membership is accorded an institution only after several years of maintaining high standards in the teaching and performance of music.

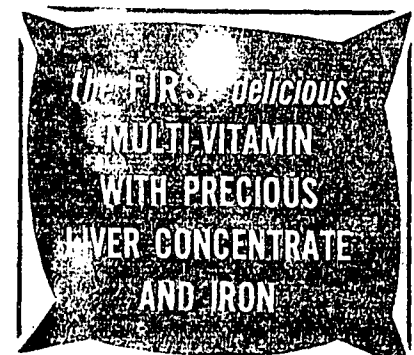

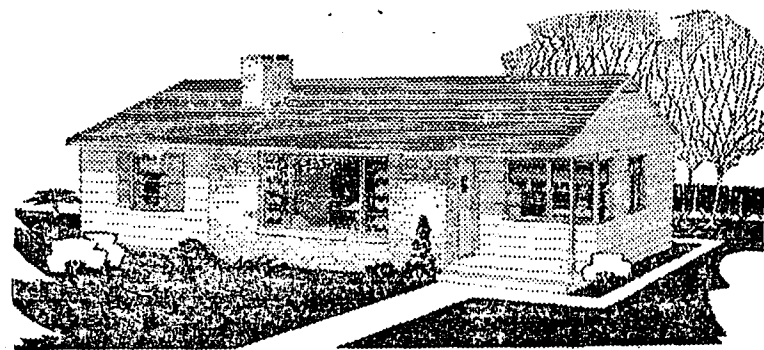
