### LATAH PIONEERS ENJOY BIG DAY

Moscow — Blue skies, spring-like temperatures and dry roads combined to form an ideal day as approximately 150 members of the Latah County Pioneer Association met at the Hotel Idaho last Saturday for their annual "mid-winter picnic" and business

meeting. Assisting Theodora V. Smith, reception chairman, in welcoming of guests, were members of the Latah County Wagon Wheels, junior auxiliary of the Pioneer Association. These latter are grandchildren and great-grandchildren of Latah County pioneers of the Wagon Wheel era. Among these were Janet and Jane Westendahl. In the business meeting which followed the 12:15 noon picnic dinner,

the Latah County Pioneer Association passed two resolutions. One petitioned the school board of Moscow's public schools, requesting that a "suitable plaque be affixed to the Moscow High School" honoring the organizer's of Moscow's public schools.

The second resolution favored the building of a Latah County Museum building on the northeast corner of the county courthouse block, a two-story modern building whose facilities could accommodate housing for the Latah County Traveling Library on one floor (if so desired), with details to be worked out at a later date. With land site provided, heat (piped from the courthouse) and light to be furnished by the county, it was recommended that funds for erection of the building be raised by a county-wide subscription.

The Association's president, Homer David, suggested a goal of the Museum's accomplishment on or before 1963, the year of Idaho's Centennial observance. At present the Pioneer Association enjoys the privilege of a Latah County Pioneer Association Museum Room in the new county courthouse. Larger quarters, however, are needed to provide adequate preservation and display of the many treasured relics of historical value already donated by the pioneers.

Charles J. Smith of Potlatch was elected vice president of the Association for the coming year, succeeding Mrs. King D. Ingle, Kendrick, who, by tradition, succeeds to the presidency. Mrs. Ingle, currently in New Mexico, had advised the pioneers to appoint another to her office, but her request was overruled. Homer David will continue as president until Mrs. Ingle's return to Idaho this spring.

### FAIRBOARD MEETS

Moscow — The Latah County Fair Board met at the court house in Moscow, Feb. 3rd.

Lawrence Curtis, Palouse, was elected the 1960 president, succeeding F. H. Brincken, Garfield, who retires after 14 years of service. Norla Callison, Kendrick, was elected vice president; Mrs. Eugene Thompson, Moscow, treasurer, and Homer Futler, Latah County agent, secretary. The 1960 Fair Board is comprised of: Leonard Curtis, Palouse; Norla Callison, Kendrick; Mrs. Andy Cox, Kendrick; Phil Greenwell, Genesee; Wayne Mayburry, Moscow; Dan McKenzie, Troy; Mrs. Wilbur Wright, Potlatch; Chester Fiscus, Potlatch, and Mrs. Eugene Thompson, Moscow.

Plans for remodeling the food booth at the Fair Grounds was presented by Gerry Hagedorn, Moscow. The group approved the remodeling of this booth, which has proven inadequate for present crowds, and directed Hagedorn to complete the remodeling plans.

Dates for the 1960 Fair were set for September 15, 16 and 17.

ORDINANCE NO. 495  
AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF RAILROAD STREET SITUATED IN THE VILLAGE OF KENDRICK, LATAH COUNTY, IDAHO; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF DEEDS TO THE OWNERS OF LANDS ABUTTING ON SAID STREET AND PROVIDING FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Chairman and Board of Trustees of the Village of Kendrick, Idaho:

Section 1. That the portion of Railroad Street of the Village of Kendrick, Idaho, beginning on a line across said Railroad Street fifty (50) feet West of the East boundary line extended of lot 10, Block 7, Original Town of Kendrick, Idaho, according to the recorded plat thereof, and extending to the West boundary line extended of Lot 8 of said Block 7, and the same is hereby vacated.

Section 2. That the Chairman of the Board of Trustees and the Clerk of the Village of Kendrick, Idaho, be, and they are hereby, authorized and directed, in the name and on behalf of the village of Kendrick, to execute and deliver to the owners of land abutting on said vacated portion of Railroad Street good and proper deeds conveying to said owners the one-half of said vacated street abutting on the land of said owners.

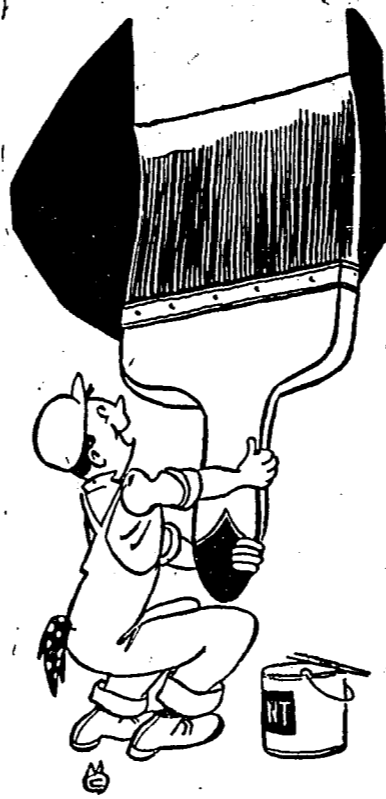
Section 3. That this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage, approval and publication.

### FEB., 1960 IS IDAHO HEART MONTH

With heart diseases killing seven and one-half times more people than traffic accidents, Governor Robert E. Smylie proclaimed the month of February, 1960, as "Idaho Heart" month.

In his proclamation, Governor Smylie called attention to the fact that the Idaho Heart Association, an affiliate of the American Heart Association, is the only voluntary health agency organized and dedicated to combat diseases of the heart and blood vessels.

Sighting that more than 50 per cent of the funds contributed during the "heart drives" are used in research projects and community service, such as supplying \$14,000 in drugs to rheumatic fever patients in Idaho, Governor Smylie urged the citizens of Idaho to welcome the volunteer heart worker when she calls.

### COUNTY URGES IMMUNIZATIONS

Moscow — The Latah County Public Health department strongly urges all parents to be certain that their children's immunizations are up to date. If a high level of immunity within a community is consistently maintained, there is far less likelihood of outbreaks of epidemics. Our medical advisors feel there is added advantage to your child receiving these immunizations from your own family doctor. It is helpful for your doctor to see your children when they are well, so that he may understand them better when they are ill. However, if this is not possible, you may take your child to the Immunization Clinics held in the

Latah County Health Department, Moscow (second floor of new court house) from 2:00 to 4:30 p. m. the first and third Wednesday of every month.

A recommended schedule for immunizations in accordance with the report of the Committee on Immunizations, American Academy of Pediatrics is as follows: (Subject to change by your family physician) — Age, third month — first dose of diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus.

Fourth month — Second dose of diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus.

Fifth month — Third dose of diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus. By six months of age — Smallpox vaccination (and repeat every five years).

Twelfth month — Tuberculin test (to be repeated every 3 years as long as reaction is negative)

Twenty-fourth month — First booster (diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus) then boosters every 3 to 4 years.

Polio shots — First shot, 3 months of age; second shot, 4 months of age; third shot, 7 to 12 months after second shot; fourth shot, 1 to 3 years after third shot.

If children have not had their immunizations at the suggested early age, these should be started immediately.

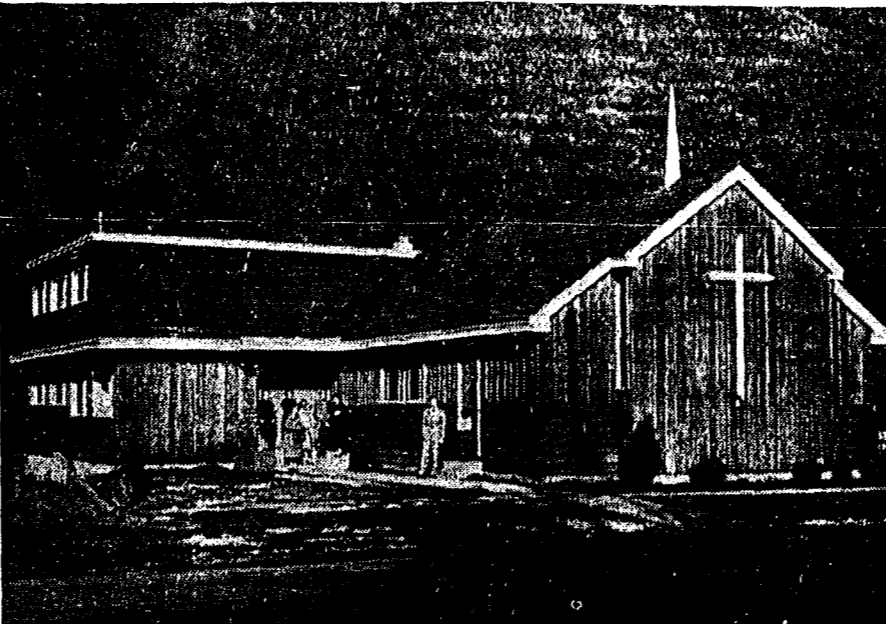
