**To Attend Summer Institute**

Logan, Utah — Among four Idahoans among the 36 secondary school teachers of French and Spanish named to attend a summer institute at Utah State University at Logan, June 13-July 22, is Doris W. Merrick, Kendrick, Idaho, Dr. M. L. Neilson, head of the language department at U. S. U. announced this week.

Participants will receive grants of \$75.00 per week, plus \$15.00 per week for each dependent while they attend the institute. Tuition will also be paid for them. The institute is supported by a \$47,993.00 grant provided under terms of the National Defense Education Act. It is part of the U. S. Office of Education Language Development Program.

U. S. U. is one of 35 institutions in the United States selected to offer

the language institute. Several guest faculty members have been chosen to join the U. S. U. language staff in teaching courses. Extensive use will be made of the university's modern language laboratory, Dr. Neilson said.

**Electricity Use Is Steadily Increasing**

Residential electric customers of the Washington Water Power Company are now using in excess of 9,900 kilowatt-hours annually, according to a report for the twelve months ending March 31. Rural customers use is even higher, at 9,600 kilowatt-hours per customer per year.

"It is difficult for the average homeowner to even realize the importance of electric service in his home and what a bargain Reddy Kilowatt is as a servant," Dean Hollenbeck, local representative said.

Comparing W. W. P. Co. customer use of power with that of the average Russian household, Hollenbeck pointed out that the Russian uses approximately 400 kilowatt-hours annually. "Only enough," he said, "to operate a 21-inch television set for three hours a day for a year, or to burn four 100-watt light bulbs for three hours a day."

Mr. Hollenbeck also drew attention to the fact that the cost of electric service is very low to the average W. W. P. Co. customer. "Our annual revenue per residential customer in 1959 was \$106.86," Hollenbeck said, "and if only one member of a household smoked cigarettes that family was spending more for tobacco than for electric service. If two members of the family smoked their tobacco bill was more than double their electric bill."

Mr. Hollenbeck also pointed out that only nine-tenths of one percent of each dollar spent by Americans went for electricity last year — and that nearly five times as much was spent for liquor and tobacco. "The ladies spent as much for cosmetics as was spent on electricity," he said. Hollenbeck added that at the present rate of increase in power use W. W. P. Co. customers will soon reach 10,000 kilowatt-hours annually, and that rural customers are virtually at that point now.

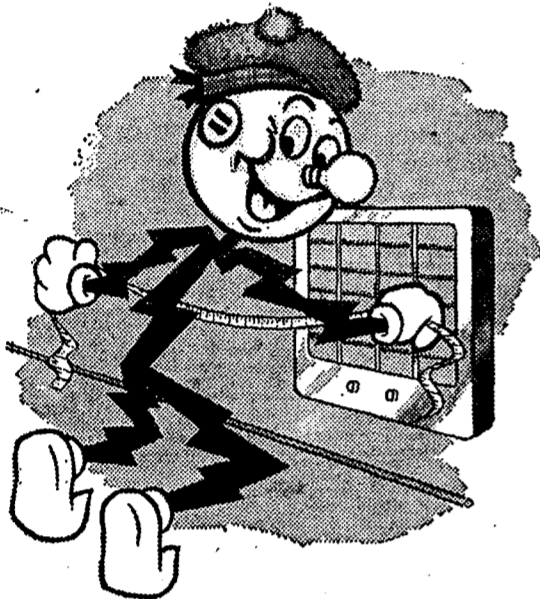

U. of I., Moscow — Orange But-

tercup, a recent squash variety, gives promise of growing well in Idaho, Homer Futter, county agent, says. Trials by Richard Foley, a horticult-

urist at the Parma branch station of the University of Idaho, showed it can be grown successfully in that area. It may be adaptable to other Idaho locations of similar soil and weather. Orange Buttercup is a small

squash with dry flesh. It is a semi-bush type with short runners. It is tolerant to curley-top.  
Tony Horn, extension horticulturist says Butternut is another good Idaho squash. It is tolerant to curley-top and fusarium diseases. Others are Umatilla Marblehead, which is resistant to curley-top, Delicious, Banana and Hubbard, all not resistant to curley-top.
