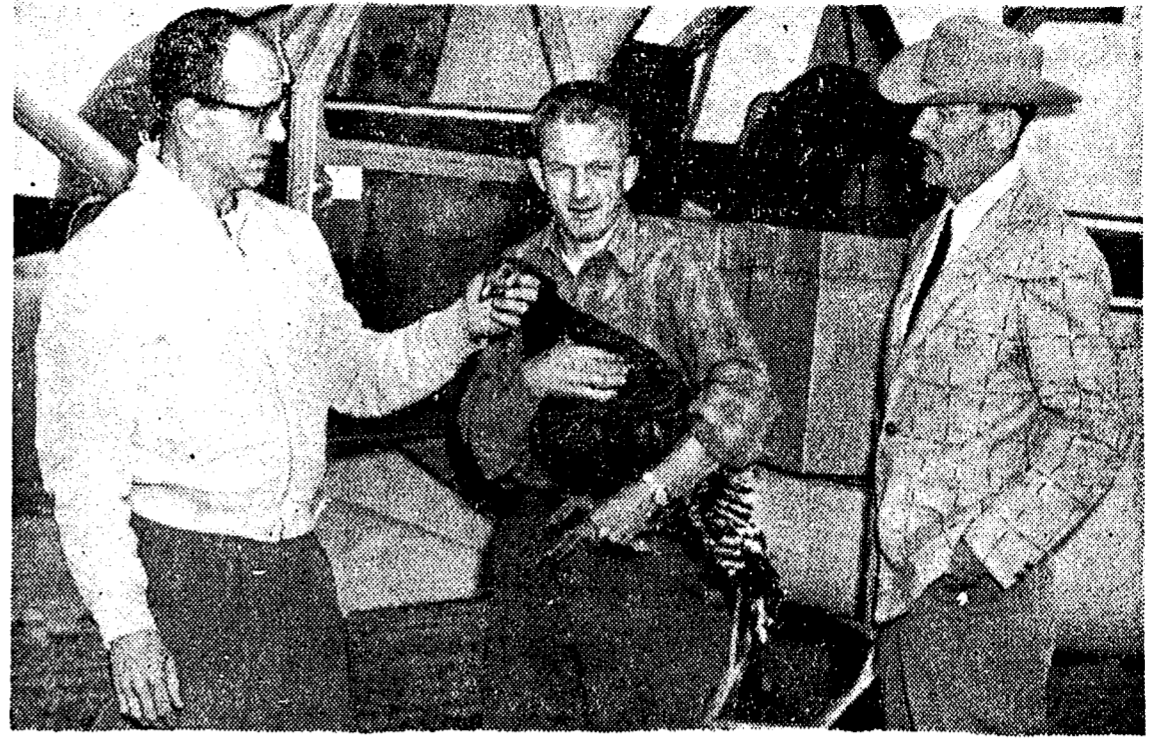

### "NYET" ANSWER ON RUSSIAN DEBATE

University of Idaho, March 15. — A challenge sent last September by the University of Idaho to debate Russian students from the University of Moscow was answered today — "Nyet."

The debate idea, spearheaded on the Idaho campus by Tom Lynch, Ogden, Utah, and cleared by the U.

S. Department of State, was refused by the Russian Embassy.

"No reason was given," said Lynch. "We regret we cannot intelligently exchange ideas. It would have been an educational experience for all concerned."

Topic for the debate as listed in the challenge was: "Resolved, that the two-party political system is superior to the one party political system."

The idea came last spring as a car load of Idaho students were returning to the campus from a Portland engagement. Lynch thought

Idaho students should debate with Russian students. Aided by Linda Kinney, Ontario, Oregon, Lynch asked the university officials what they thought about it. They suggested the students get State Department sanction.

The students were given the green light by the State Department and "Project Challenge," as the Idaho debaters called it, was launched with a letter to the students at Moscow, U.S.S.R. Idaho's senators and representatives aided in getting the State Department clearance for the project.

A State Department letter to Lynch ended the wait for the answer to the challenge. The Russian students would not debate.

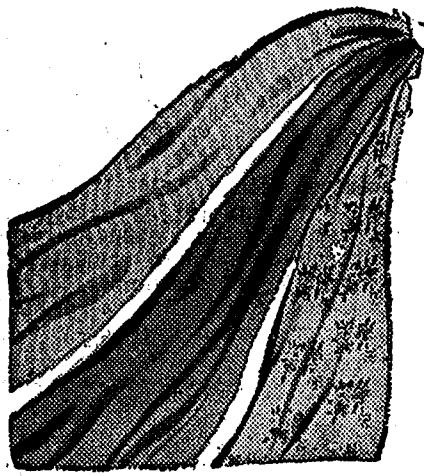

His first state government experience was in 1949, when he was elected to the Idaho Senate.

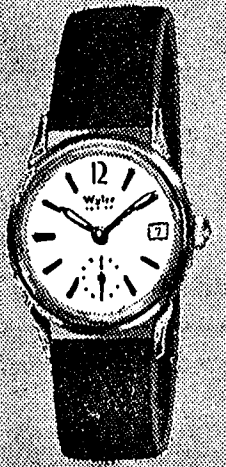
### BLACK RECEIVES POULTRY AWARD

U. of I., Moscow — A University of Idaho extension poultryman has received a top award in recognition of outstanding leadership in the poultry industry during 1961.

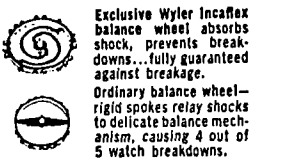

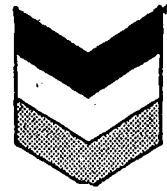
