#### Mrs. Ernst Fliger Dies

Mrs. Ernst Fliger, 88, a resident of Juliaetta since 1906, died Wednesday morning of last week at 4:30 o'clock in the Pine Manor Nursing Home at Coeur d'Alene. Death was attributed to the infirmities of age.

Mrs. Fliger (Martha Marie) was born Dec. 8, 1874, in Germany. She moved to the United States and to Bingham Lake, Minn., when she was two, living there until 1904. She spent the next two years in Germany, then moved to Juliaetta in 1906.

She married Fliger Nov. 24, 1898, in Minnesota. He died in 1941. Mrs. Fliger was a member of the Zion

Lutheran Church of Juliaetta. Surviving are a son, Carl, Julia-etta, and seven grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.



stand from 10 to 20 times as many freezings and thawings as regular concrete, and therefore is especially suited for use in all outside flatwork sucvh as driveways, patios and

work such as driveways, patios and sidewalks. Air-entrained concrete costs about the same as regular concrete, ac-cording to Wilson, and is easier to place and finish. The same methods of mixing are used with air-entrained concrete as with regular concrete. And here Wilson cautions that well-graded ag-gregate and sand be used. Ideally the larger pieces of aggregate are surrounded by smaller pieces of ag-gregate. These in turn are surroundgregate. These in turn are surrounded by smaller and smaller particles of sand. All are bonded together with the cement paste.

Concrete becomes concrete when the chemical agents in the cement powder react with water. As this reaction takes place and water is used up the mass hardens. If too much water is used, the excess must either evaporate or it is within the mass. Trapped water weakens concrete, making it more susceptible to damage through freezing and thawing.
