There were 11 present for the session. Gerald Ingle, secretary, read the minutes of the last meeting,

which were approved. George Brocke, Sr., Latah county representative, explained to those state budget, as received by him from the budget committee. In this field he said that contrary to the beliefs of many the Education Fund was not the largest in the state,' it being at approximately \$57 million, and the state highway fund at \$92 million. The proposed budget of the State

Fish and Game Department, and its request for more money and higher licenses fees was noted. Here the Club took action, passing a resolution against the proposed license fee increase — believing that a little economy here and there would solve that department's problems.

The re-districting of the state as regards representatives came up for round-table discussion. Mr. Brocke said he did not believe Latah county, due to its increased population, would be affected, and no action was taken on this matter.

A round-table discussion was also held on the possible impact of the beginning of construction of the Bruce's Eddy Dam on the Southwick-Kendrick area and on the schools in Joint District No. 283. Mr. Brocke and Mr. Ingle said preliminary information led them to believe that as many as 1,000 people would be coming into the Southwick-Kendrick area, and that an increase of about 200 in pupils was expected. However, this would have to await conferences with representatives of the Army Engineers and State Board of Education.

Mr. Brocke said that the Troy-Kendrick road link was on the 1964 schedule for construction. Here the Club, after some discussion, passed a resolution asking that the Highway Department do all in their power to HORSE MAKES BOW speed construction of this link looking toward increased traffic as work began on the big dam.
