SOIL LOSSES AS OF FEBRUARY 6

Moscow - Soil losses had been negligible prior to last week-end in the Latah SCD; slow rains had soaked up winter wheat fields with but little run-off.

After the rains and thawing weather of the week-end, erosion is general on almost all fields. Frozen ground greatly aggravated the condition. There are numerous small rills out on the hills, and on long slopes and drain-ways there are fair Ida Lind and Mr. and Mrs. Paul bad and amounts to 50 tons of soil per acre -- or about one-third of an

Run-off water accumulated on the long slopes into big streams and in some cases dumped silt on roads and
