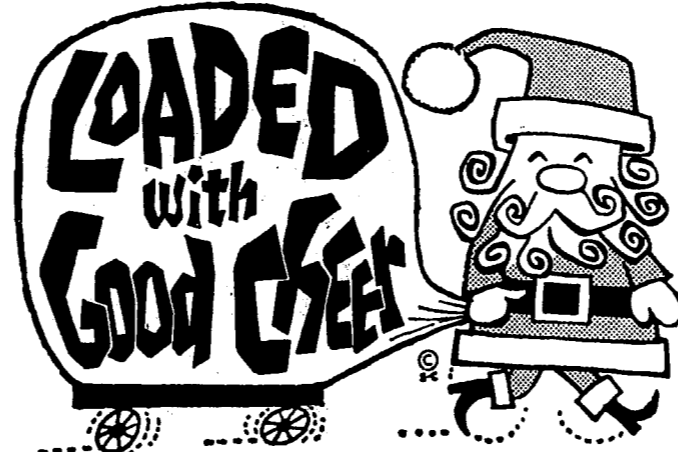
**K. K. KLUB HOLDS



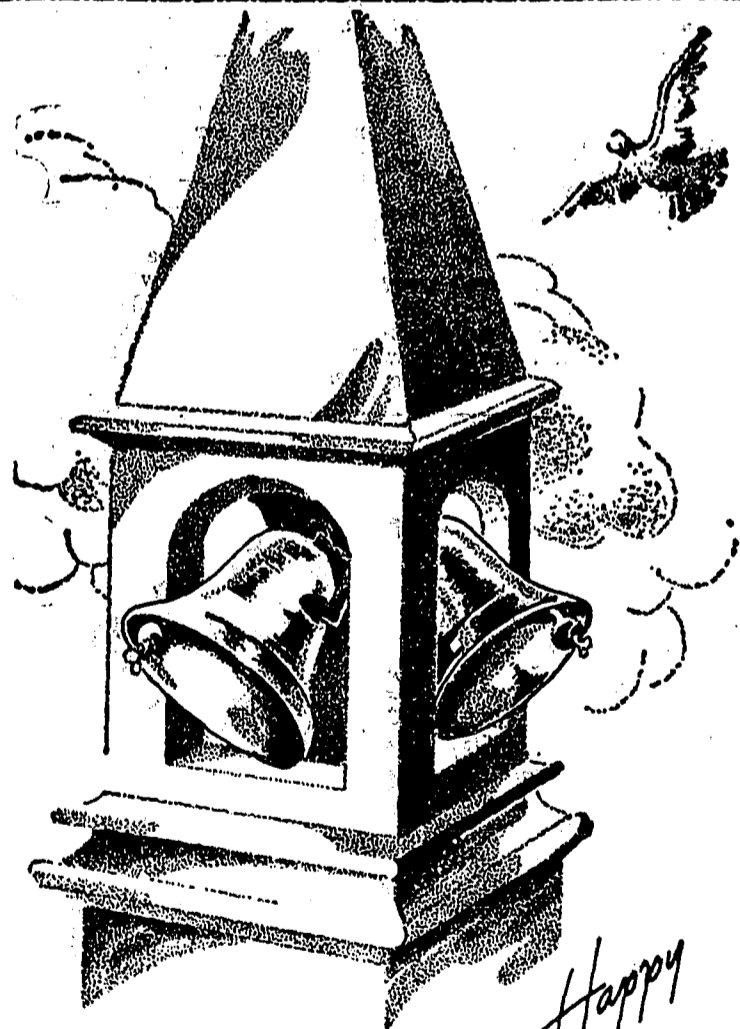

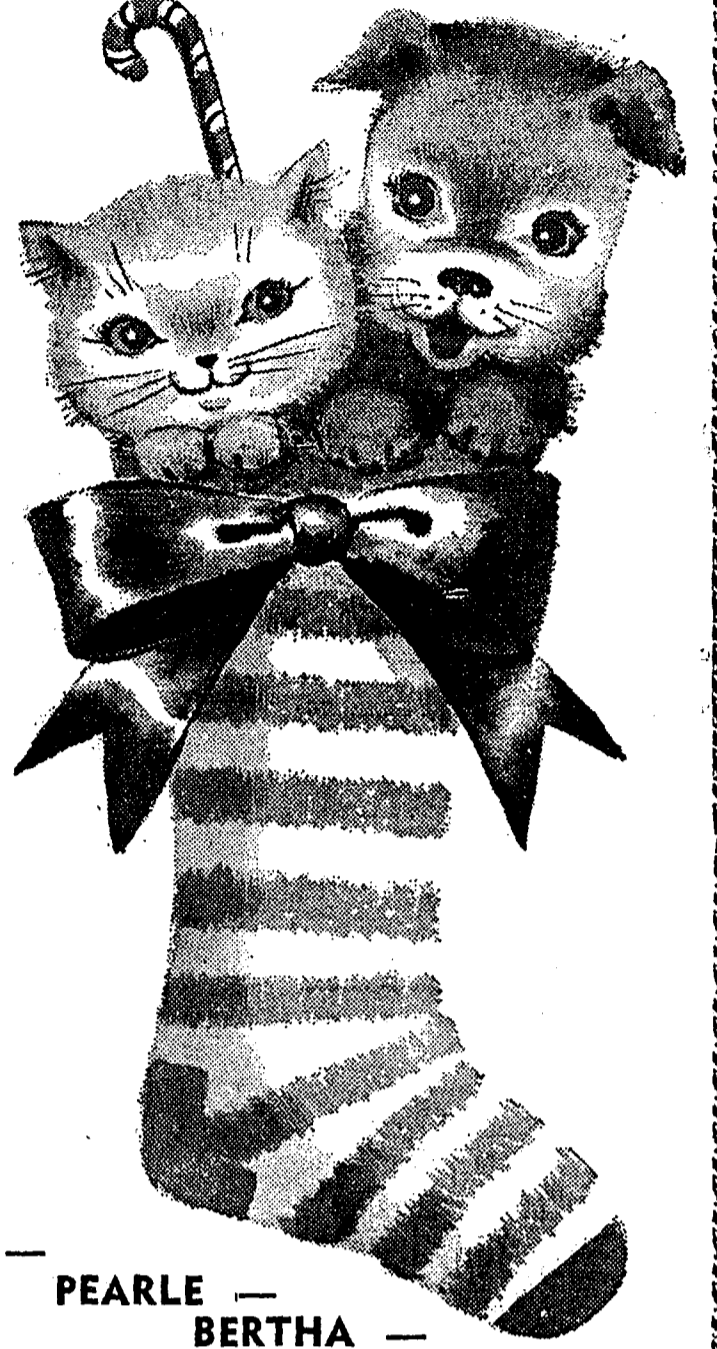
