Final Rites For Ernest Walsh Funeral services for Ernest J. Walsh, 73, a retired track supervisor for the Northern Pacific Railroad in the Kendrick-Juliaetta area, and a resident of Juliaetta for more than 20 years, were held at Short's Chapel in Moscow at 11:00 a. m., Friday, December 27.






