**FAST FLIGHT HOME
FROM INDIA**

"How can one leave this country in a hurry?" was the question put to the American Consulate in Madras, India, by we Meyer sisters upon learning of our father's passing. The answer was: "You really have a job on your hands."

We then began to work for one clearance and one flight, and since my papers were most in order Hermy helped me to get on the first available flight. Hermy and I went our separate ways to towns the distance of 100 to 150 miles for two days, getting permission to leave and return to India from the Dist. Supt. of Police, taking cholera shot, and getting the special Govt. Seal, obtaining income tax clearance permits, both in the local district and place of departure, and making the earliest and quickest reservations possible.

The last day before the flight was spent in turning over accounts and business of the boarding home, school and village work. Business that usually required a couple of months for transaction was completed in three days — a real miracle and a sign that I was to go home.

The journey home took 50 hours, which included a 12-hour stop in Tokyo and several other brief stops. I flew from Madras on Jan. 5th via Nagpur and Calcutta, India, on to Tokyo with short stops at Bangkok and Hong Kong. From Tokyo I crossed the Pacific with stops at Honolulu, Los Angeles, Seattle, arriving in Spokane Tuesday at noon.

In crossing the International Date Line two days were duplicated for me — in Calcutta on Jan. 6th; in Tokyo on the 7th — Honolulu on the evening of the 6th and home again on the 7th.

It was good to know that my cable had been received as I saw my brother Ted, and uncle Gerald Schmidt waiting at the Spokane airport. The seemingly impossible had been achieved and I gave thanks for God's guidance and Hermy's help.

A leave of absence has been granted to me up to the 1st of March, when I shall fly back to India. Hermy expects to come home later, perhaps during April and May, the time of our regular hill leave. — Dorothy Meyer.
