From Mrs. Robert Morris (nee Beverly Schupfer) there came a most interesting letter recently which said in part:

"As you probably know, our family is spending the current academic year in Switzerland, where my husband is doing solid state physics research at the Federal Institute of Technology in Zurich.

We live in a nine-story apartment house near the edge of the city and about 20 minutes by streetcar from downtown. European cities are not so spread out as ours in the United States.

Our two little boys, now aged 3 1/2 and almost 5, were somewhat bewildered at first to find themselves three stories high when it came time
