Storm Damage Heavy

The bridge crossing the Potlatch was damaged, about 15 feet drop-ping down so there was no approach from the opposite side. Three fam-ilies, Mr. and Mrs. Emmett Brandt, Mr. and Mrs. Carroll Groseclose and Mr. and Mrs. Kinsey Hofer were standed over Christmas. A foot bridge was put up Saturday by men from both sides of the river, so it is now possible to walk across. It is not known just when repairs for vehicle traffic will be made.






