### Storm Damage Heavy

The storms of last week seem more like a bad dream instead of a reality now. The swollen Potlatch river took its toll along its banks, and even though the storm didn't last long, damage was severe. The property belonging to Gene Burch of Lewiston was under water, and his cattle had to be evacuated to higher ground. The bridge crossing the Potlatch was damaged, about 15 feet dropping down so there was no approach from the opposite side. Three families, Mr. and Mrs. Emmett Brandt, Mr. and Mrs. Carroll Groseclose and Mr. and Mrs. Kinsey Hofer were stranded over Christmas. A foot bridge was put up Saturday by men from both sides of the river, so it is now possible to walk across. It is not known just when repairs for vehicle traffic will be made.

The Cedar Creek Cattle Co. also suffered from the flooding. The cattle were stranded on an island for a couple of days. Bruce Sherman managed to get his horses out but not before the corral was under water.

Railroad tracks near the Leon Bansom home were under two feet of water at one place. The Roy Whittum gravel pit was also flooded. The Mead & Howard Lumber Co. were busy moving lumber from the sawmill to the planer to keep it from being washed away after the dike was damaged at the mill.

However, after listening and reading other storm reports — this vicinity was pretty lucky.

The Bill Thornton and Lloyd Craig yards were full of water, and the creek was running over a bridge near the Gordon Peters' home. The road rocks was kept busy trying to keep rocks and slides out of roads and diverting water, trying to keep it from damaging roads. The most damage was done to Cherry Lane grade. A culvert plugged, letting all the water go across and into the road, and the grade was badly damaged.

The north end of the old Juliaetta bridge was badly damaged when the Potlatch river went on a rampage. A pier collapsed and the approach was washed out, stranding four families on the North Juliaetta grade. Saturday these families pitched in, and with volunteer help built a cross walk for foot travel.

Thursday we had snow again, and Christmas was a beautiful day. It was a perfect winter scene, with sunshine, though it was cool and crisp, with the temperature around zero in the morning.

More snow fell Saturday and Sunday, and the road crews were kept busy those days plowing and sanding. Saturday and Sunday 15 inches of new snow fell in the upper country. Monday it snowed again all day long. All the main roads are now well plowed, but side roads are just passable.

## VOLUNTEER WORKERS FILLING SANDBAGS DURING FLOOD



## ATHLETIC FIELD IS SAVED BY HARD VOLUNTEER WORK

Somewhere around 100 real volunteer workers who furiously filled, hauled and placed between 2500 and 3000 sandbags, saved Muscat Field and three adjoining homes from the raging waters of Bear creek last Wednesday afternoon. They were assisted by a bulldozer belonging to the Mead & Howard Lumber Co., and operated by Norman Lewis.

The sandbags were filled first at a gravel pile near the Kendrick High School, and when that was soon exhausted, the workers moved to a village gravel pile just above the Arthur Foster home. Four-wheel drive pickups were used to transport the bags from the gravel pile to the edge of Bear creek, and with the bulldozer assisting, the save was made.

Water just entered the Chas. McCarthy home, and later he was able to move back in — but it carried away his woodshed, wood and coal piles. The Dick Pippin family also were evacuated, but water did not quite enter their home. Mrs. Dave Gentry was also evacuated.

About 3:30 o'clock the creek began dropping, and left behind a muddy morass, complete with debris.

A little later in the afternoon the Potlatch river began dropping, and on Thursday morning had fallen an estimated three to four feet.

As it fell owners began assessing property damage, which might have been lots heavier.

Mrs. Estella Leith found about 15 inches of water in her basement, which effectively put the furnace out of operation. The basement at Burts Confectionery also had about 15 inches of water in it, and a big pump was used to clear it out. It did not reach or damage the compressor motors.

At the Kendrick Rochdale Co. about six feet of water filled the big grain dump, and pumps were used to remove it. Further down the line Brocke & Sons were forced to remove all their motors and conveyor belt from underneath their seed cleaning plant, and pumps were in use to remove the water. There will be a big job here in replacing all the equipment.

The basement of the new Henry Wendt home on west Main Street also required a pump. The Burton Souders home basement also had a little water, but no particular damage was reported there.

Several say "this was the highest water we have ever seen at Kendrick" others say "it was higher in 1932-33." It is hard to judge, as the river, due to diking and channel changes looks different, and in the Bear creek section the same is true. In the latter area the N. P. railway has worked on the channel several times, rock crushers have been set up and rock taken from the creek bottom — so here again, the old landmarks have changed.

On Bear creek, near where the last rock crusher set was made, the current apparently was changed enough that it swirled against the east bank and took out the road. Foot travel is all that is now possible between the C. H. Fry home and the Bear creek bridge.

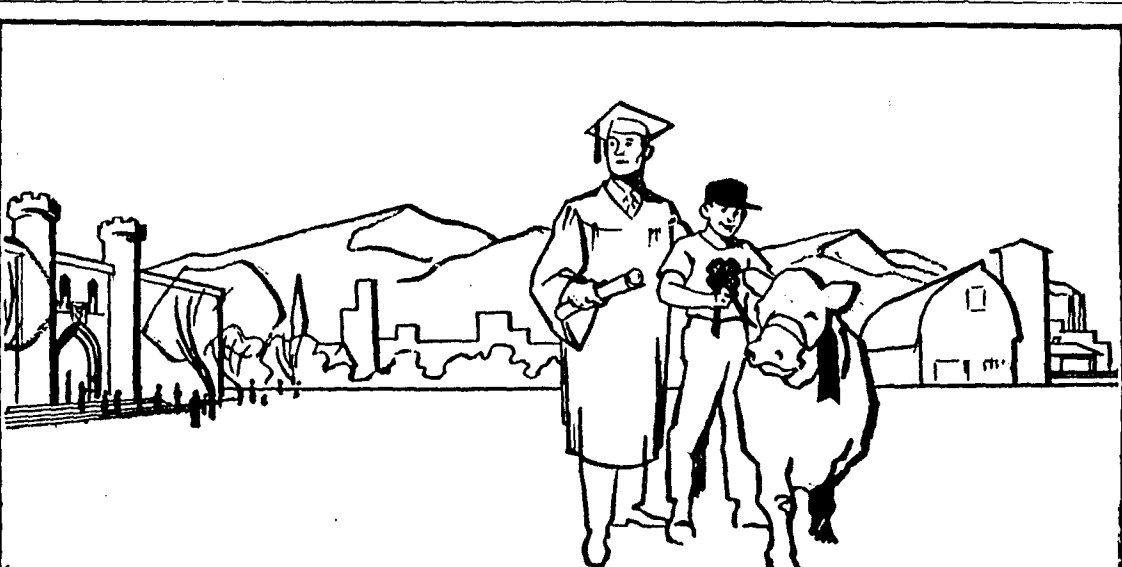


