# MRS. NORA CUSTER, PIONEER, PASSES

Mrs. Nora E. Custer, a pioneer of the Juliaetta area, moving there in 1918, passed away at the Rest Haven Nursing Home in Clarkston, February 8th, having made her home there since 1960.



Mrs. Custer was born at Harlan, Iowa, March 11, 1878. She was married to Benton C. Custer, Feb. 11, 1897. Mr. and Mrs. Custer moved to Juliaetta in 1918 from Bloomfield, Nebraska. They farmed in the area until his death in 1943. Mrs. Custer then moved to Troy, Idaho, for a short time, then to Portland, Oregon, and then to California. She returned to this area in 1949, making her home with a son at Pullman until entering the Home in 1960.

She is survived by two children: Mrs. G. A. Grove, Portland, Ore., and Everett Custer, Pullman, Wash. One daughter, Mrs. Fred Schuler, preceded her in death. Five grandchildren, 13 great-grandchildren and two great-great-grandchildren also survive, as do two sisters and a brother who reside in Iowa.

Committal services were held on Thursday, Feb. 11 at 2:00 p. m. at Normal Hill Cemetery, Lewiston, with the Rev. Bruce Groseclose officiating. Brower-Wann Funeral Chapel was in charge.
