Environmental shock produces cleft lips and cleft palates in mice, reports the University of Michigan. 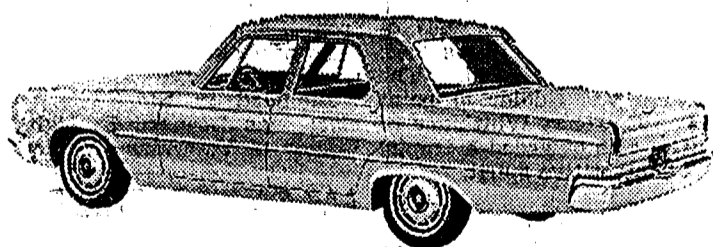

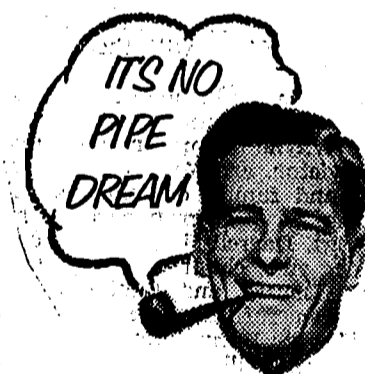
