PICK RAMS FOR MORE TWIN BIRTHS

U. of I., Moscow — Sheep producers may be able to increase the number of twins and triplets in the lamb crop by selecting rams for this characteristic, a University of Idaho study indicates. The study, conducted by animal scientists with the Idaho Agricultural Experiment station, suggests that rams influence multiple births in sheep much more than has been commonly believed. It also provides evidence that multiple births may be a hereditary sire trait.
 Some rams consistently sired a relatively high percentage of lambs as twins or triplets. Other rams just as consistently sired fewer multiple births. There is some indication that heredity may be involved, since rams tend to perform like their sires in producing twins and triplets.
