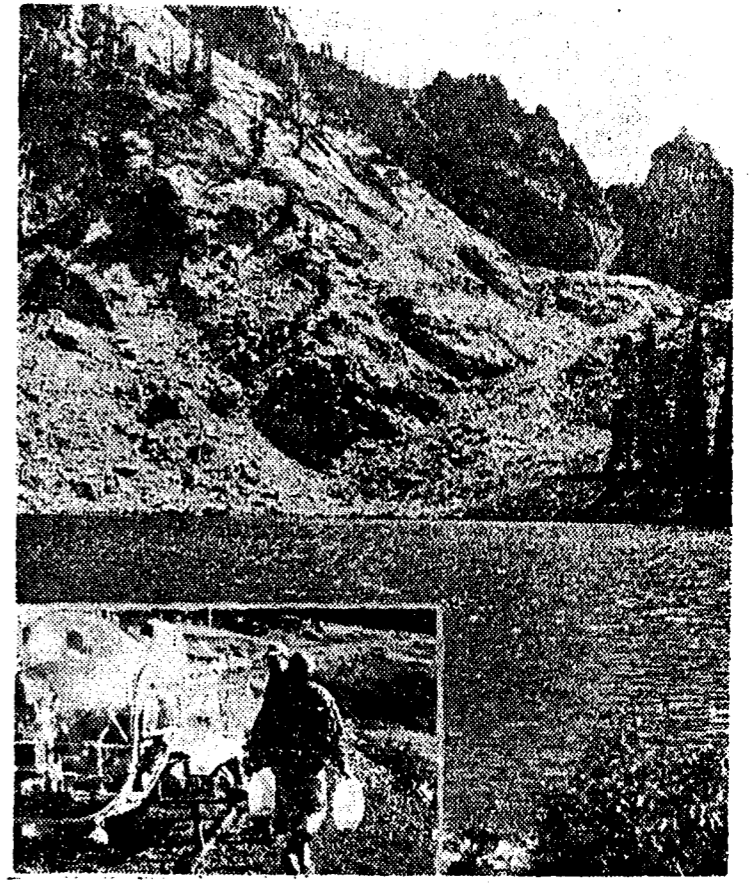

Boise — Planting remote lakes by helicopter is the latest fish stocking technique used by the Idaho Fish and Game department.

Through a cooperative arrangement with the U. S. Forest Service, the department sub-leases the whirlybirds at half price when they other-

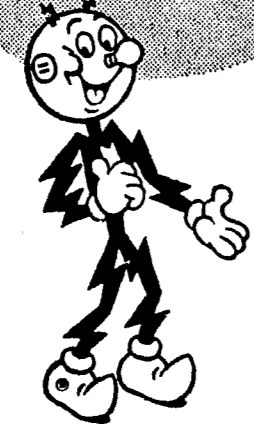

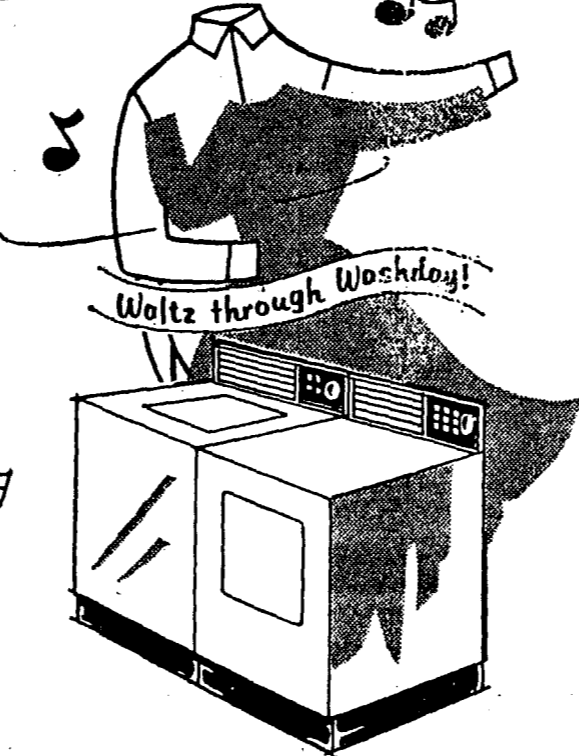

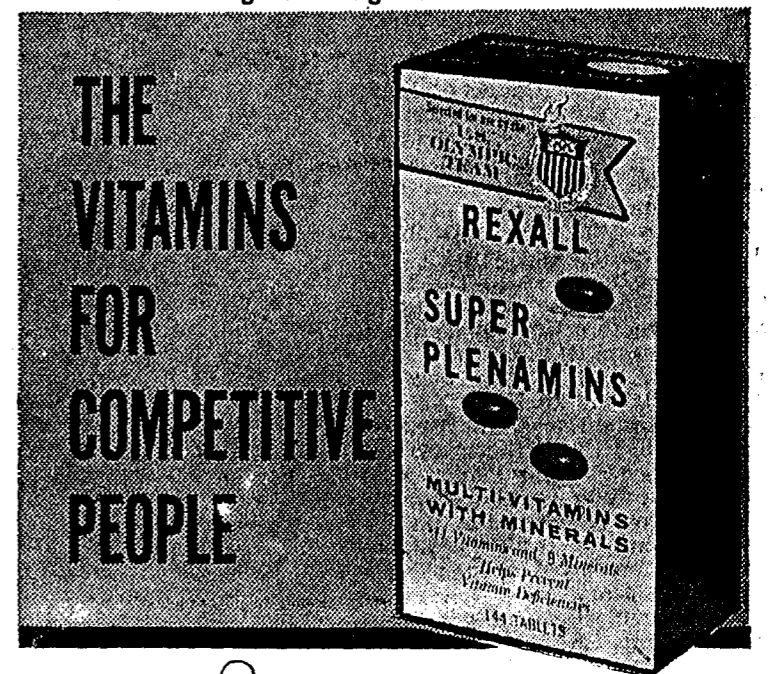
