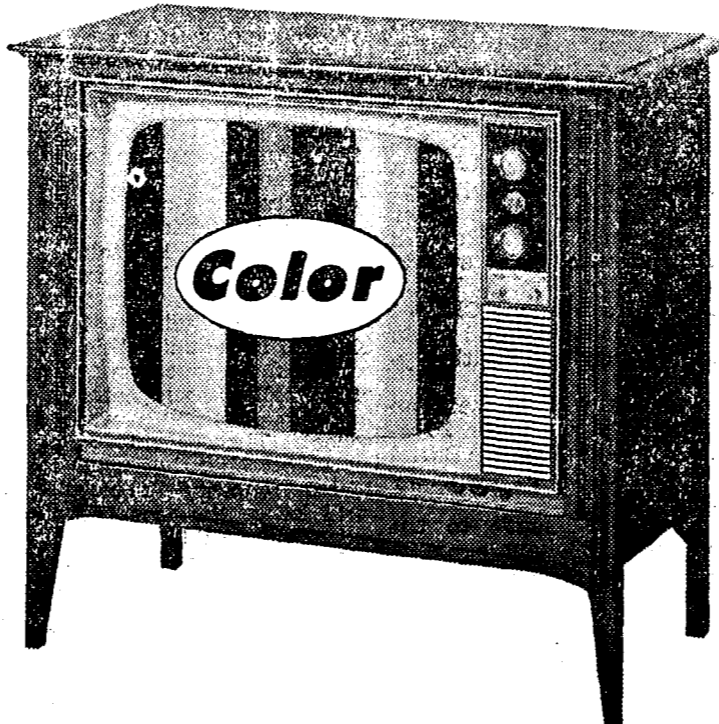



Ordinance No. 187. An ordinance establishing the powers and duties of the Mayor of the City of Juliaetta.

Section 1. The Mayor, the superintendent and administrative officer of the City of Juliaetta.

Section 2. The Mayor is authorized and empowered to sign, for and in behalf of the city.

Section 3. The Mayor may borrow money on the credit of the city when so authorized by the Council.

Section 4. The Mayor, whenever he deems it expedient, is hereby empowered to offer a reward not exceeding one hundred dollars.

Section 5. The Mayor is empowered to grant a pardon to any person imprisoned for a violation of any of the ordinances of the City of Juliaetta.

Section 6. The Mayor shall have jurisdiction over all places within five (5) miles of the corporate limits of the City of Juliaetta.

Section 7. The Mayor shall have power to veto or sign any ordinance passed by the City Council, provided that any ordinance vetoed by the Mayor may be passed over his veto.
