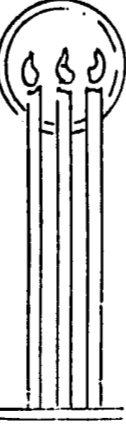

**W. W. P. CO. PAYS
HUGE TAX BILL**

Spokane — Checks totaling \$1,016,613.06 for payment of the first half of The Washington Water Power Co.'s 1967 Idaho property tax bill have been delivered to the treasurers of ten Idaho counties.

The final payments to be made in June will bring the total to \$2,037,251.77. J. P. Buckley, tax agent for W. W. P. noted that the utility's 1967 Idaho tax bill was up \$14,327 over 1966.

"Much of this increase is due to growth of our electrical and natural gas systems, the remainder from increased assessments and increased levies," Buckley said. "WWP's Idaho property tax payments are up more than one-quarter of a million dollars over what they were five years ago."

First half payments to be made in each of the ten Idaho counties are as follows: Benewah, \$28,933; Bonner, \$302,339; Boundary, \$2,603; Clearwater, \$42,809; Idaho, \$38,189; Kootenai, \$175,151; Latah, \$98,062; Lewis, \$21,940; Nez Perce \$197,687; Shoshone, \$111,915.
