**BROKEN WATER PIPE  
 FORCES CLOSURE OF SCHOOL**

GENESEE—A broken six-inch water main servicing the Genesee Public Schools, forced another closure of that institution Thursday morning. The school had just reopened following a two day closure because of the snow storm which prevented buses from completing their routes in the rural areas.

The break occurred in the main located six feet underground back of the Vocational Agriculture building. The leak was discovered shortly after seven Thursday morning. Supt. of Schools Lester C. Drill dismissed classes after the main service was turned off to the school in order that repairs could begin. Lack of water affected the operation of the school furnace, cafeteria, and rest rooms.

The broken pipe was dug up and repairs completed later in the day. School resumed Friday. Cause of the break is not known.

**IDAHO MUSEUM DISPLAYS  
 PHOTOS AND FRAMES**

A detailed photographic study of the Notre Dame du Haut chapel in Ronchamp, France, designed by world famous French architect Le Corbusier, is on display at the University of Idaho Museum through January 19, according to G. Elms Bureau, museum director.

The 35 black-and-white photographs specially prepared by the American Institute of Architects focus on the startling yet deeply religious aspects of the chapel. "The boldly projecting brown concrete roof, extensive white-washed walls, and irregularly placed stained glass windows," said Bureau.

"Le Corbusier, a leading prophet of modern architecture and city planning, designed the structure as a pilgrimage church. The concrete building illustrates a radically new architectural style. . . . intensely personal, departing from his overly-refined, functional designs of previous decades."

The museum is open daily from 1 to 5 p. m.

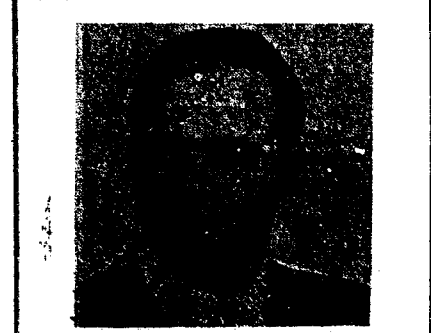

 2 cups (well-packed) brown sugar  
 3 eggs  
 2 1/2 cups flour  
 2 1/2 tsp. baking powder  
 1/2 tsp. salt  
 1 tsp. vanilla  
 1 (6-oz) pkg. chocolate chips  
 1 cup pecans  
 Mix shortening with brown sugar. Add eggs, one at a time, and mix well. Add flour, baking powder and salt which have been sifted together. Add vanilla and chocolate chips and pecans. Pour in greased 8x13x2-inch pan. Bake at 350d. F. oven 30 minutes. Cool, ice if desired, and cut in squares
