Our recipes this week are from Mrs. Lind, who sent us such a generous selection to choose from a while back — so not hearing from any of you Kendrick or Genesee ladies—we took advantage of her generosity and are using a few more this week for our column. Soon be housecleaning time—that time of year to sort, clean out drawers, etc.—so while you are going through your recipe files, pick out a few for our column. Warmer weather means more entertaining—school activities, showers, weddings, etc. So help your neighbors and friends round out their entertaining menus with some of your favorite recipes.

Happy Easter to One and All Overnight CINNAMON ROLLS

1 cup shortening
 ¾ cup sugar
 2 ts. salt
 1 cup boiling water
ADD—
 4 lightly beaten eggs
 2 yeast cakes, softened in ½ cup warm water
 7½ cups flour
 1 cup cold water.
 Add alternately the flour, eggs, yeast, and cold water to the 1st mixture. Beat together with a spoon. Grease dough and place in refrigerator over night (no kneading).

DOUGH WITH FILLING:

1 cup sugar
 ¼ cup butter
 Cinnamon
 Roll up like a jelly roll. Let raise 1 hour. Bake 20-30 minutes at 400°.

SWEDISH MEAT BALLS

1½ lbs. ground beef
 1½ lbs ground pork
 2 ts. salt
 1 cup bread crumbs
 1 ts. allspice
 ½ ts. nutmeg
 1 small onion
 2 eggs
 ¼ cup butter

Combine meats, salt, and blend; add bread crumbs that have been soaked in water, then drained. Stir in spices and onion. Add eggs, one at a time, mixing well.

Shape into 1½-inch balls. Brown in the butter, add water to cover; cover pan and simmer 1½ hours. Add bouillon cubes; stir till dissolved. If desired thicken with sauce. Yield 48 balls.

RICE DELIGHT

2 cups cooked rice
 ½ cup sugar
 1 cup drained crushed pineapple
 2 cups miniature marshmallows
 1 3-oz. pkg. strawberry gelatin
 1 cup boiling water
 1 cup pineapple juice, (add enough water make 1 cup)
 1 envelope dessert topping mix
 ½-cup cold milk
 ½ ts. vanilla
 Mix rice, pineapple, sugar and marshmallows in a bowl and set aside. Dissolve gelatin in boiling water and add pineapple juice. When slightly thickened, beat with mixer.

Prepare dessert topping according to instructions. Add both to rice mixture. Chill several hours or overnight. Garnish with additional dessert topping and maraschino cherries, when ready to serve. Serves 8.
