#### Genesee School Mill Levy Vote Is Monday

GENESEE—This coming Monday, April 13th the people in Genesee School District will be asked to approve a levy of three mills above the 30 mills allowed by law for maintenance and operation of the schools for the 1970-71 school year. If approved the mills would only be assessed for one year. The mill levy will raise approximately \$14,500.00. After looking at the preliminary budget it was determined by the board that this amount would be necessary to hold the present educational program and to do the maintenance that needs to be done. This years budget shows a loss of revenue over last years because of a slight decrease in state funds and some vocational and federal funds. It should also be remembered that no book fees will be charged next year. Included in the maintenance would be replacing some windows in the old building and remodeling of library facilities to help meet accreditation standards. Library furniture would also be purchased and needed classroom equip-ment. Some of the monies would also be spent on district transporta-
