The Idaho State Wheat Growers Association will hold its annual convention December 11 through 13 at the Rodeway Inn in Boise, it was announced today by Robert Drake, of Plummer, president of the association.

Drake said this year's session will include two panel discussions concerning topics of vital importance to the grower delegates: "The Russian and China Wheat Sales" and "The Occupational Safety and Health Act and How It Affects Agriculture."

To date, featured speakers for the convention include White House representative John Foltz, newly-elected Congressman Steve Synns, Dean Attus Mullens of the University of Idaho Agriculture College and Ray Davis, vice president of the National Wheat Growers Association.

Drake added that approximately 200 grower delegates from throughout the state are expected to attend the two and one half day event.
