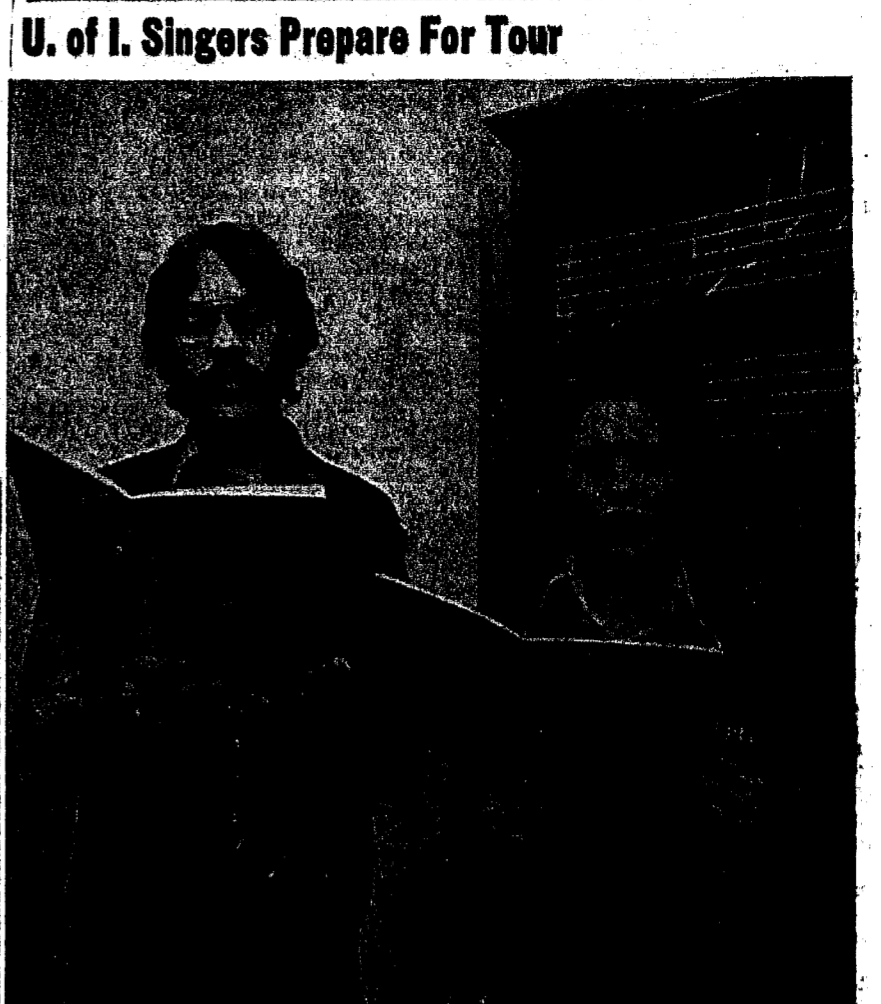

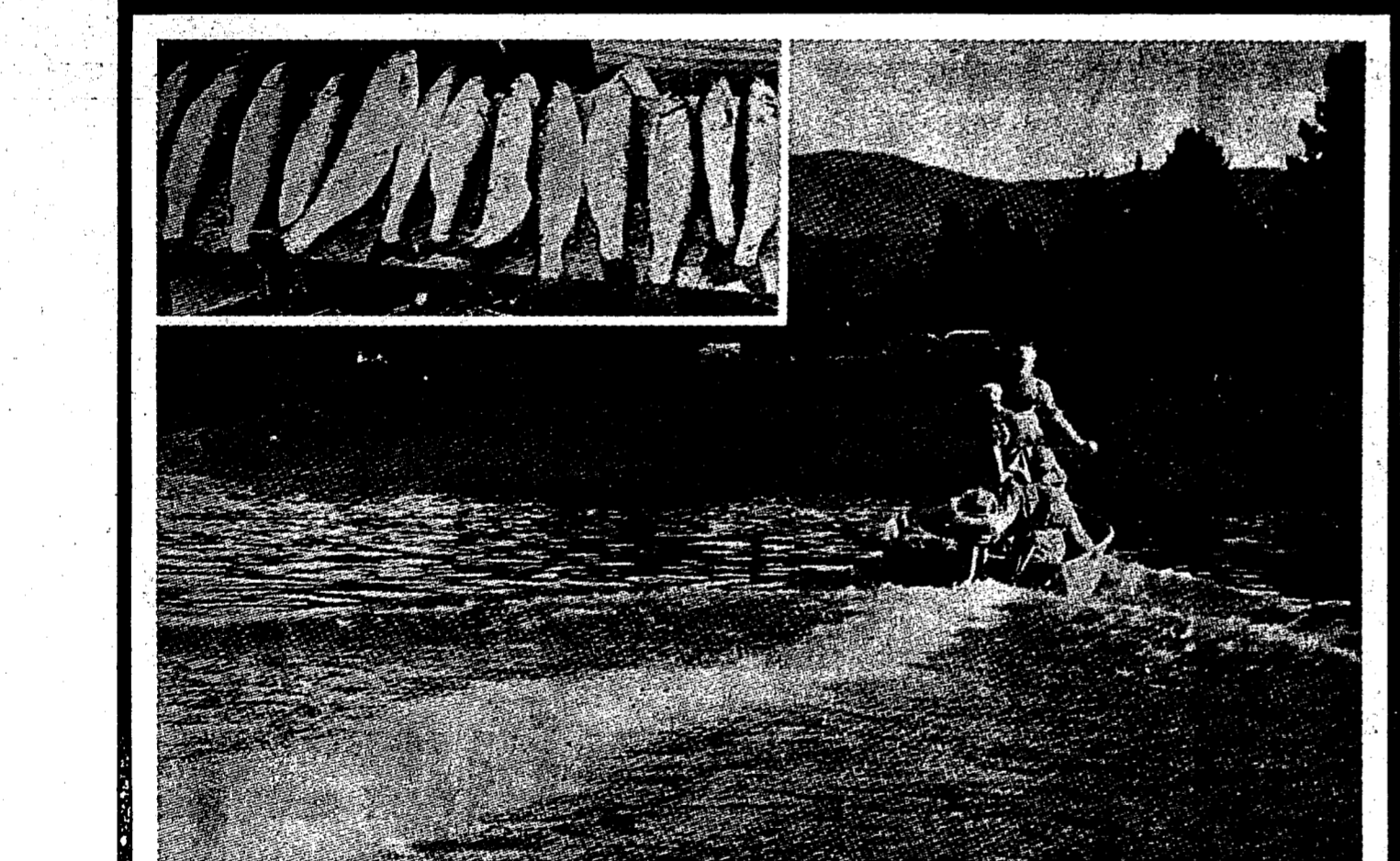
Genesee News—50 YEARS AGO

SCRIPTURE CAKE
 3/4 cup soft Genesis 18:8 (butter)
 1 1/2 cups Jeremiah 6:20 (sugar)
 5 Isiah 10: 14, separated (eggs)
 2 cups sifted Leviticus 24:5 (all-purpose flour)
 3/4 teaspoon II Kings 2:20 (salt)
 3 tsp. Amos 4:5 (baking powder) w/soonse,
 1 teaspoon Exodus 30:23 (cinnamon)
 1/4 teaspoon (each II Chronicles 9:9 (cloves, allspice, nutmeg)
 1/2 cup Judges 4:19 (milk)
 3/4 cup chopped Genesee 48:11 (blanched almonds)
 2/4 cup finely cut Jeremiah 24:5 (dried figs or dates)
 3/4 cup II Samuel 16:1 (raisins)
 Whole Genesee 43:11 (blanched almonds or walnuts)
 Cream Genesis 18 with Jeremiah 6. Beat in yolks of Isiah 10 until stiff; time. Sift together Leviticus 24. II Kings 2, Amos 4, Exodus 30 and II Chronicles 9. Blend into creamed mixture alternately with Judges 4. Beat whites of Isiah 10 until stiff; fold in. Fold in chopped Genesee 43, Jeremiah 24 and II Samuel 16. Turn into 10-inch tube pan that has been greased and dusted with Leviticus 24. Bake in 325 degree oven 1 hour and 10 minutes, until cake is golden brown. The cake tester inserted in cake will come out clean. Cool 10 to 15 minutes; remove from pan and cool separately. Serve drizzled with burnt sugar syrup and decorate with whole Genesee 48.
 Makes 1 10-inch tube cake.
 Burnt Sugar Syrup
 1 1/2 cups Jeremiah 6:20 (sugar)
 1/2 cup Genesee 24:25 (water)
 1/4 cup Genesee 18:3 (butter)
 Melt Jeremiah 6 in heavy skillet over low heat; continue cooking until syrup is deep amber. Add Genesee 24; cook until syrup is smooth. Remove from heat; add Genesee 18 and stir until melted. Cool. Makes approximately 1 1/4 cups syrup
