RULES AND REGULATIONS
 This show is open to anyone who wishes to participate.
 Entries will be received from 8:00 to 9:30 a. m. on May 26, 1973. Any entry received after 9:30 will be placed in a non-competitive class or sub-class.
 Exhibits, ribbons, etc. may be removed at 6:00 p. m.
 Show will be open to public at 12:00 p. m.
 This is a standard show and all judging shall be done by the standard system.
 Award shall be one blue, one red,

one yellow and one white to each class or sub-class where merited.

Exhibitors may make only one entry in each class or sub-class.

Containers for horticulture will be furnished. Artistic design containers and accessories to be marked with owner's name.

All entries in horticulture must have been grown by the exhibitor and LABELED as to variety whenever possible. Flowers used in the Artistic Designs need not have been grown by the exhibitor. Some fresh plant material should be used in each class or sub-class. NO ARTIFICIAL FLOWERS OR FOLIAGE PERMITTED. Accessories permitted except where so stated in the schedule.

The decision of the judges will be final.

The flower show committee will use every precaution to protect your property but will not be responsible for loss or damage to persons or property.

Additional classes may be created as needed.

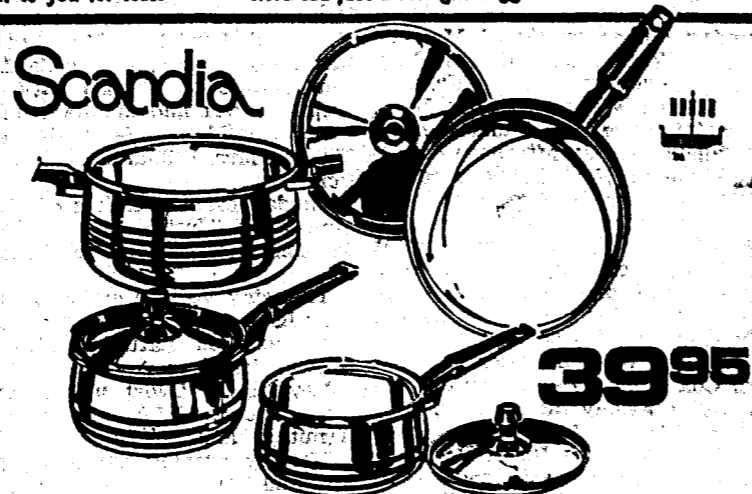

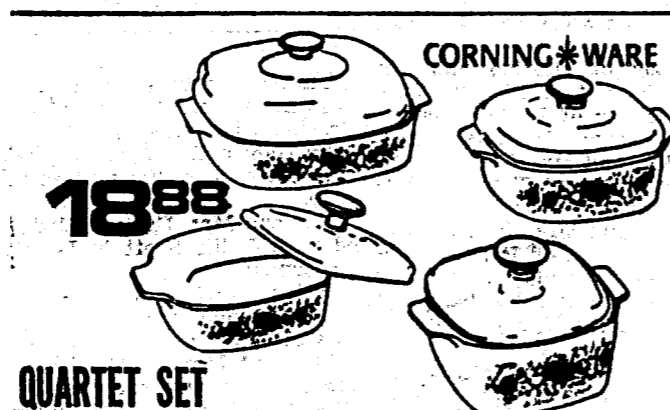

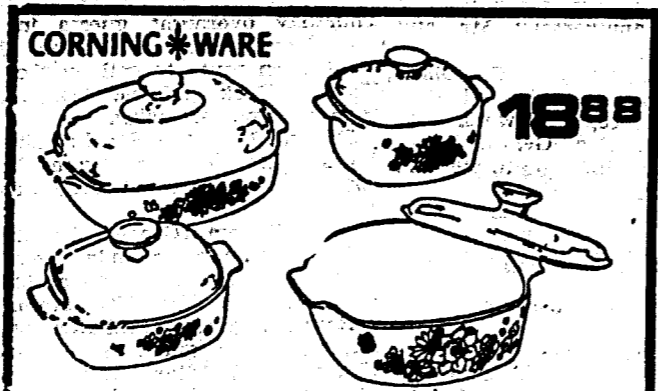
