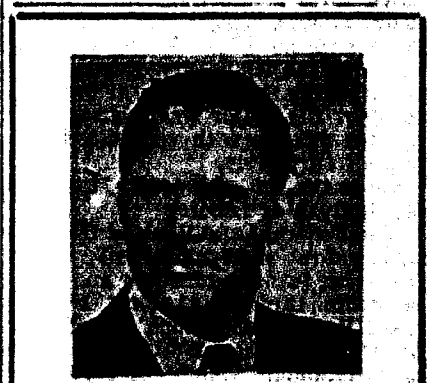
The Geo. Andersons To Celebrate Golden Anniversary June 29

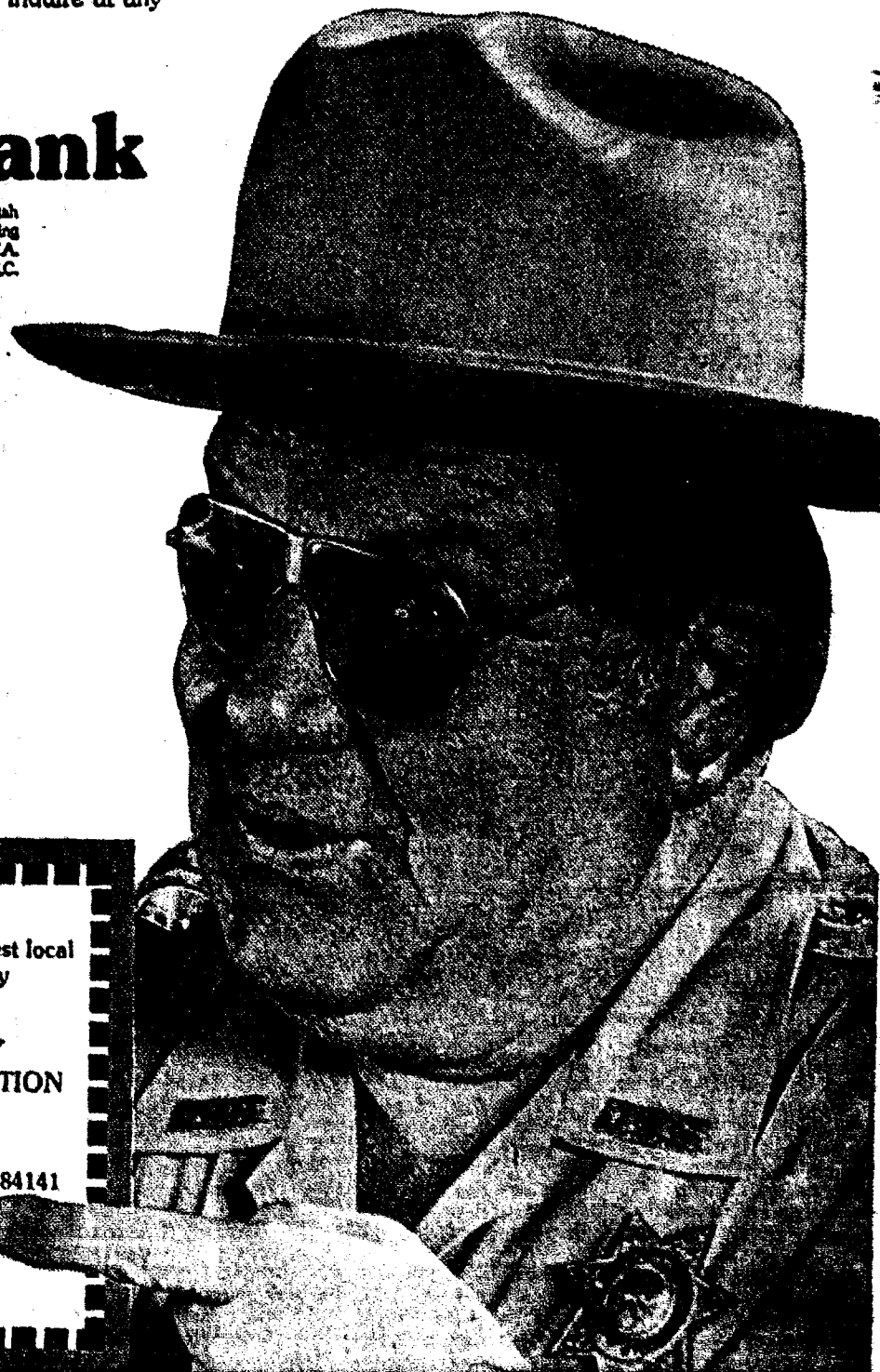

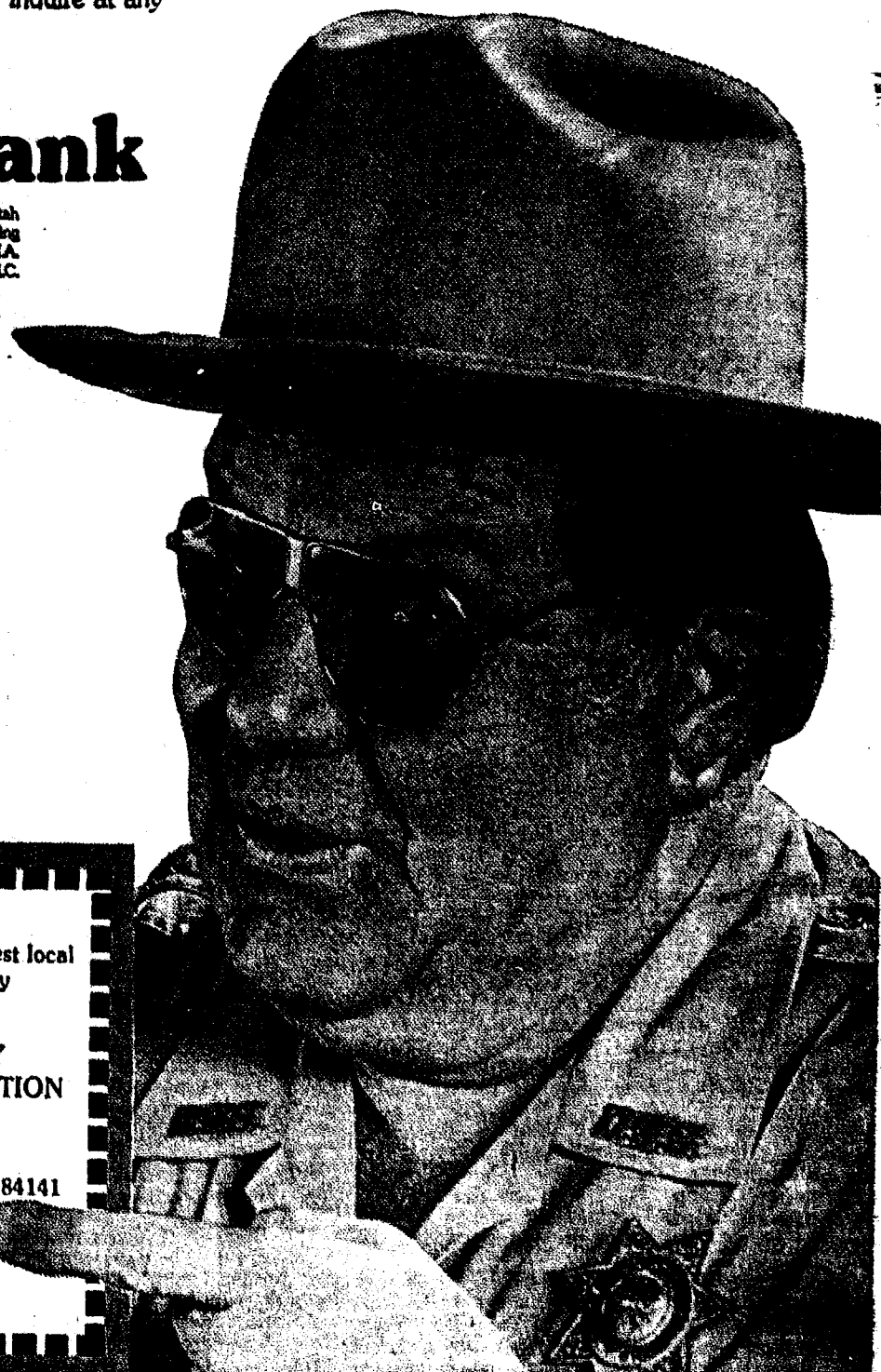
