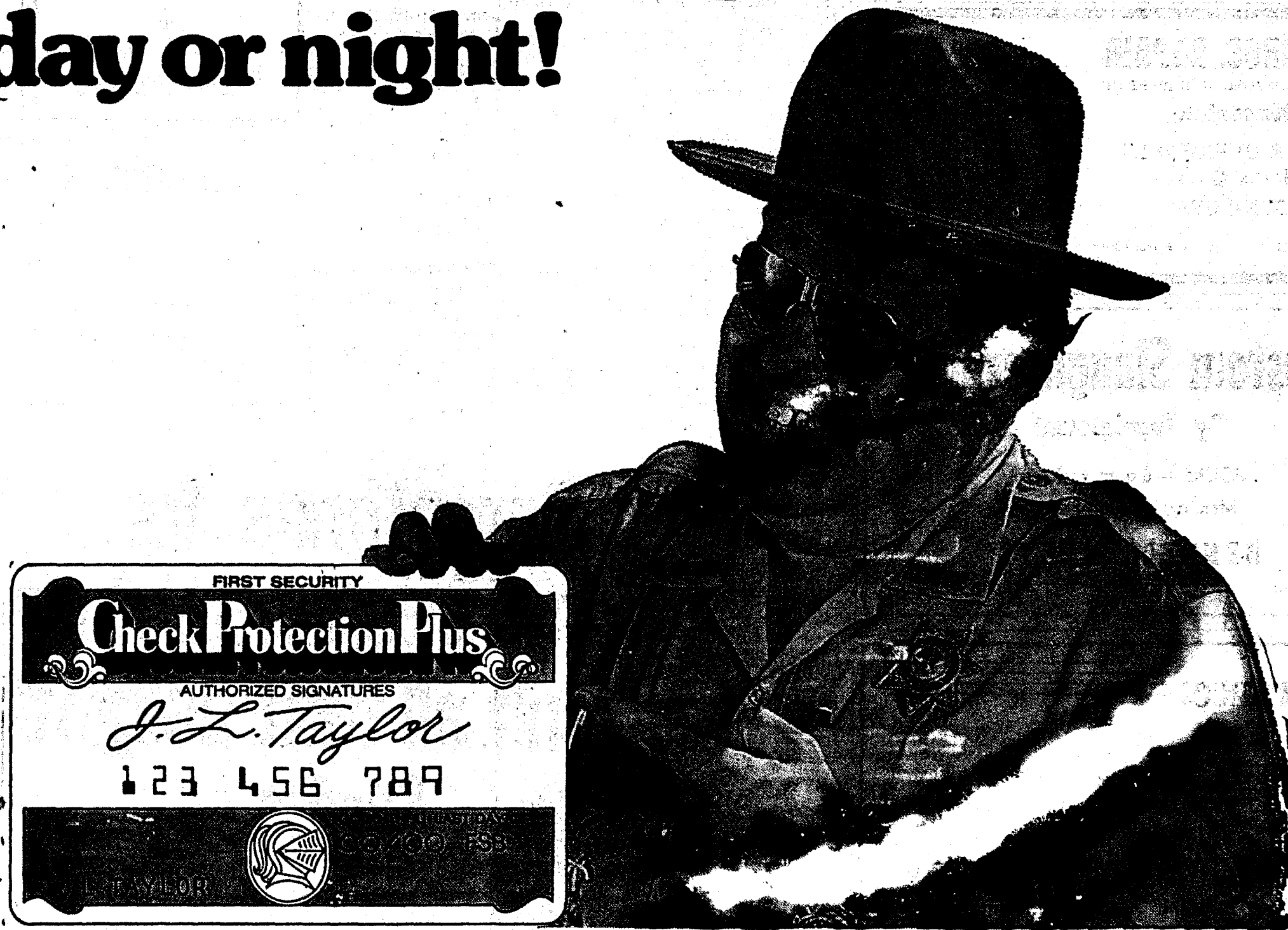

## NOTICE OF LETTING

Sealed Proposals Will Be Received by the Idaho Transportation Board Office of the Idaho Transportation Department, Division of Highways, 3311 West State Street, Boise, Idaho, until Two o'clock, on the 20th day of August 1974, for the work of re-roofing the Bovill and Potlatch Maintenance Buildings, known as Idaho Project Building Nos. 4431 and 4011 in Latah County.

Proposals must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the requirements of Section 109—Proposal requirements and conditions of the Idaho Standard Specifications for highway construction, Edition of 1967.

Plans, specifications, form of contract, proposal forms, and other information may be obtained at the office of the Idaho Transportation Department, Division of Highways, Boise, Idaho, and from the District engineer at Lewiston, Idaho.

A charge of Five Dollars (\$5.00) will be made for each copy of proposal to be made by the contractor payable to the Idaho Transportation Department, Division of Highways.

The right is reserved to reject proposals, or to accept the proposals or proposals deemed best for the State of Idaho.

No proposal will be considered unless accompanied by an acceptable proposal guaranty in an amount not less than five percent of the total amount of the proposal. This guaranty must be made in the form of a certified check or a cashier's check drawn on an Idaho bank and payable to the Idaho Transportation Department, Division of Highways, or a bidder's bond.

Bidders shall be licensed in the State of Idaho by the State Contractors License Board except on projects involving federal funds. The successful bidder on projects involving federal funds shall obtain such a license before award will be made, as provided in subsection 107.03 of the Idaho Standard Specifications, Edition of 1967.

The contractor will be required to pay not less than the minimum wage rates on Form SP-L-2 in the advertised specifications and bid proposal. Such rates will be made a part of the contract covering the project.

The Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 (U. S. C. A. Title 29, Pars. 201-218, Chap. 8) shall apply in the employment of labor for this project. It is the purpose of the Idaho

I am myself, and you are here again.

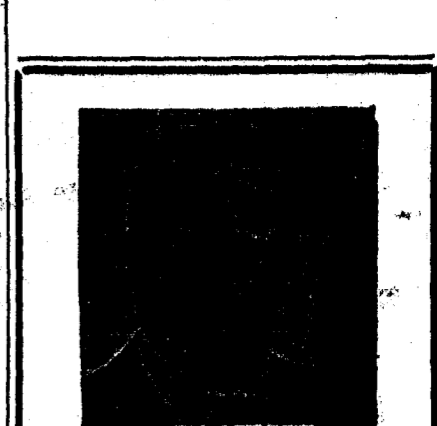

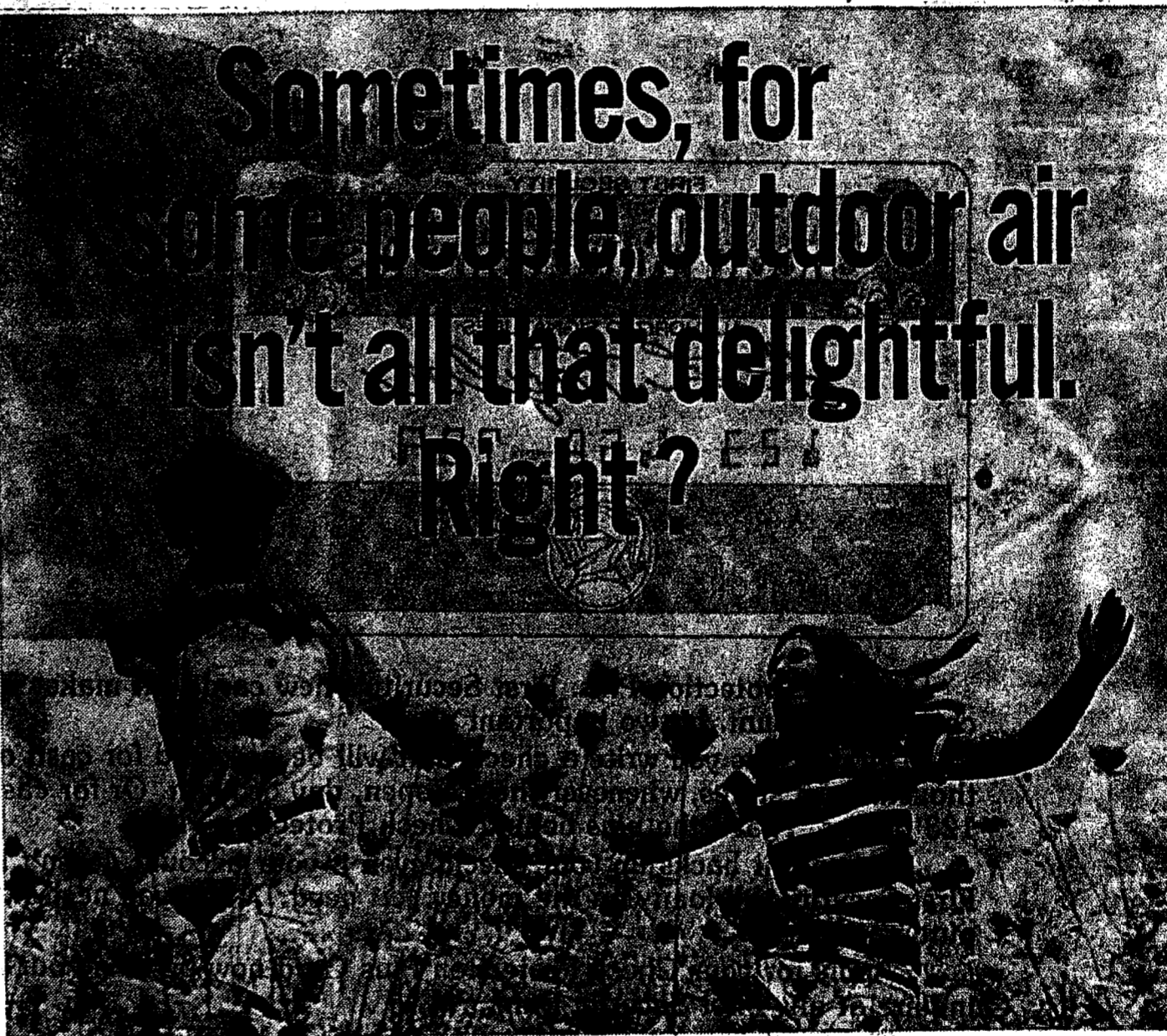
