Controlled Beaver Permits
A total of 745 beaver from 48 controlled trapping units has been authorized for the 1974-75 season in allotments ranging from 5 to 40 animals. This is 11 more units and 170 more beaver than last year. Controlled beaver trapping unit instructions, regulations and application cards are being mailed to licensed trappers. These must be on hand or postmarked by the 5 p. m. deadline September 18 at the Boise headquarters office. They will be entered in the public drawing September 19, beginning at 9 a. m. Successful applicants will be notified by mail.

IDAHO DEPT. OF EMPLOYMENT

The number of workers finding employment through the Moscow office of the Idaho Department of Employment remains stable. Frank J. Hartstein, Moscow office manager reported that his office found jobs for 14 Latah county workers during the past week. He said that this compared with 10 workers being placed on jobs during the previous week and with 13 persons given job finding help during the same week a year ago. Hartstein said that his office still had some jobs, mostly for experienced and well-trained workers. Jobs that do not require experience or training, he said, are filled quite rapidly. Among the 38 jobs still open are those for a wool presser, a legal secretary, typists, a carpenter and a variety of domestic and cafe workers.

Unemployment insurance recipients declined in number during the week, Hartstein's report continued. He said that a total of 26 workers filed new claims during the week, but that the total dropped from 241 last week to only 227 at the end of the current week. A year ago, when the area's forests were closed due to extremely dry weather, there were 297 persons in the county seeking jobless pay benefits.

NOTICE TO PARENTS AND GUARDIANS OF SCHOOL AGE CHILDREN

In compliance with the requirements of 33-202, notice is hereby given that: In all school districts of that state, every parent or guardian of any child between the ages of seven and sixteen years shall cause such child to be instructed in certain specified subjects. Every such parent or guardian shall cause such child to attend a public, private or parochial school, during a period equal to that portion of each year during which the public schools are in session in such district and shall cause such child to conform to the attendance regulations established by the board of trustees of such school district.

When a duly licensed physician or psychiatrist shall certify in writing that the physical or mental condition of a child is such that it does not permit attendance at school and upon a finding by the board of trustees that the best interests of the child or the school will be served by exempting such child from attendance, then the board of trustees may grant such exemption during the continuance of such disability. A petition for exemption for such cause may be initiated by the child or by its parent or guardian.

Before the board of trustees may exempt any child who is an habitual truant whose conduct would disrupt school order or discipline, the board shall notify the parents or guardian and afford them an opportunity to appear and show cause why the exemption should not be granted. When exempted for such cause, the probate court shall be notified and said child shall come under the purview of the youth rehabilitation law.

LUNGS THAT LAST

The human lung has not changed for thousands of years. But the air it must breathe has changed. Dramatically. The result is a crisis on human survival.

"Our lungs were not built for and cannot withstand the things that are being sucked into them every day," says Dr. Gareth Green of the American Thoracic Society, the medical section of the American Lung Association. According to Dr. Green, a healthy lung, one not assaulted by cigarette smoke and air pollution, can—within two hours—kill 90 percent of the germs and bacteria that attack the lungs. But cigarette smoke and pollution weaken the de-

fenses of the lungs. The lungs of a heavy smoker, Dr. Green says, require 24 times longer to destroy the invaders in the air.

There is no evidence that the lung itself is adapting to the assaults upon it. Genetic studies on generations of families in highly polluted countries indicate that can is not building stronger lungs to cope with smoking and pollution. Instead, the human lung is being eroded. "We will have to build a new type of immunology—perhaps a shot for the lung—so that it can hold up under what is happening to it," Dr. Green says.

Studies now show that pollution in Tokyo and Yokohama is, by itself, producing a form of crippling asthma. And cigarette smoking is the

chief cause of long-term lung disease.

In one puff of smoke, there are 500 different kinds of solid particles and 250 different types of gases. "You can even identify formaldehyde and cyanide in the residuals we find in a

smoker's lung," says Dr. Green.

Symms Says: There Is An Answer To

INFLATION

One would imagine that the American people are weary of the political rhetoric consistently bombarding them concerning inflation. It seems as though everyone in government is against inflation but nobody is doing anything about it.

Recently, the taxpayer was forced to foot the bill for \$100,000 worth of additional inflation rhetoric when the House passed a resolution authorizing a six-month "emergency study" of the causes and effects of inflation. The measure passed the U. S. Senate July 9th.

One would think there must be something very mystical and elusive about inflation the way politicians keep carrying on. In reality, it is one of the most simple and basic of all economic phenomena. The literal meaning of "inflate" is "to increase the volume from within." When we speak of monetary inflation—the erosion of the buying power of our money—we are referring to the process of increasing the volume of currency (and credit) in circulation. The federal government does this by spending in excess of that which it takes in from direct taxation. The deficit is made up by printing additional new dollars, thus decreasing the value of each dollar we hold. Inflation is in reality nothing more than

a very clever hidden form of government taxation. Price inflation is one of the effects of monetary inflation. So, does Congress need to spend \$100,000 to further "It's Naked Rhetoric" explore the nature of inflation? Hardly. Congress knows inflation as a mother knows her child. This so-called "inflation study" is nothing more than naked political rhetoric. It was conceived as a way in which Members of Congress could show their "deep concern" over inflation for the benefit of their constituents.

to the need for a balanced budget and instead begin work toward that end. Everyone in Washington, D.C. says deficit spending is bad, yet precious few will specify how and where they will cut back on federal spending. Instead, Congress votes to spend ever more inflationary dollars. Measures such as I have introduced, calling for a Constitutional Amendment to stop deficit spending and balance the budget, are bottled up in committees chaired and controlled by the Majority Party. Meanwhile, measures which serve only to turn up the volume on the rhetoric breeze through both Chambers of Congress.

There is, I suppose, a good side to all of this. By authorizing "The Cause Is Congress"

the \$100,000 venture, Congress did an excellent job of identifying the cause of inflation right there on the floor of the House. It didn't need the services of a single bureaucrat or government economist either. The point was made better than any "study group" could make it—that the cause of inflation lies with Congress itself, which continues to spend money it doesn't have on programs it doesn't need. One doubts, however, that Members of Congress got the message. I want to continue emphasizing that message!
