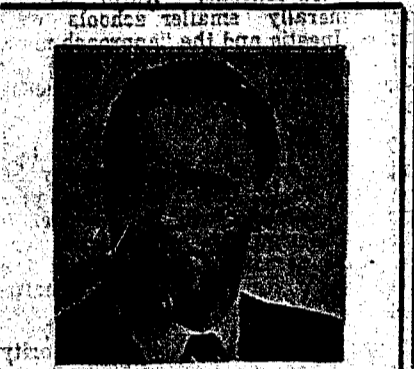

**Public Service Employment Program**

Providing opportunities for permanent public service jobs for unemployed and underemployed persons is the objective of a program which began operation in the five-county north central Idaho region August 19. Authorized by Title II of the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA) of 1973, and managed by the Association of Idaho Cities (AIC), the program provides grants to local government units for hiring qualified unemployed persons to fill anticipated vacancies in existing new public service positions, with the understanding that new jobs will eventually be funded by the local governments themselves.  
 Lynn Hoesford, the AIC Manpower Coordinator in charge of the program in Clearwater, Idaho, Latah, Lewis and Nez Perce counties, is working through the Clearwater Economic Development Association office in Moscow, visiting area city and county officials to explain this CETA program. Actual interviewing and hiring is done by the city or county government in association with the local office of the Department of Employment. AIC's involvement includes paying employees' salaries and fringe benefits at least until the end of the present fiscal year.  
 Interest in the program has been expressed by a number of local governments which are in need of additional employees but are short of funds. All cities and counties are eligible for this state-wide effort to provide good jobs for unemployed persons while meeting critical public service needs.
