

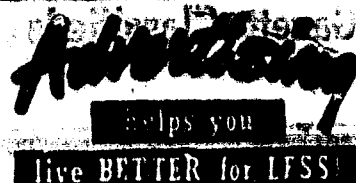

**DEPT. OF EMPLOYMENT**

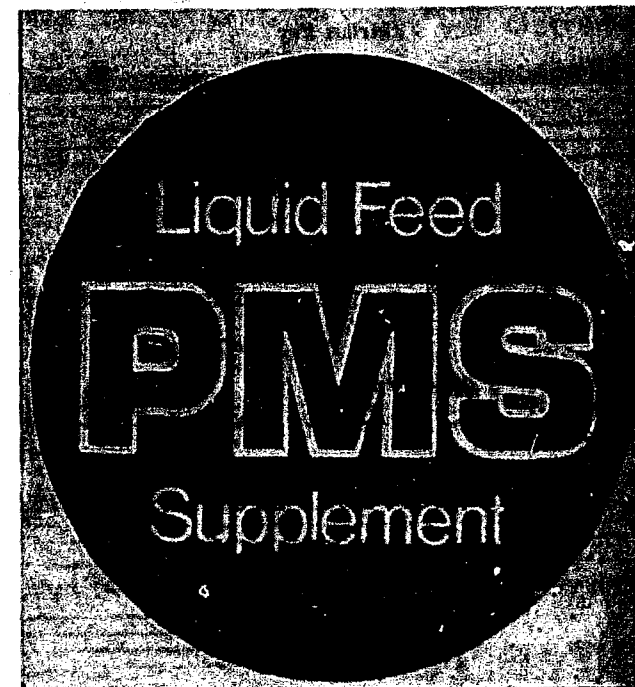
Little change was noted in the placement of job seekers in Latah County last week. Frank J. Hartstein, Moscow office manager for the Idaho Department of Employment, reported that his office placed a total of 5 local job seekers during the week. During the previous week six were given job finding help while the same number received similar assistance during the last week of 1973. At the end of the week, there were 6 jobs still open, the same as a week ago.

Unemployment continued to mount as 60 persons filed new claims during the week. This brought the total up to 527 from the previous week's 498 and compares to last year's 448. Hartstein's report indicated that the poor condition of the lumber market was responsible for the bulk of the new unemployment in the area. In the immediate Moscow area, there are now 190 persons seeking benefits compared with 179 last week and 247 a year ago. In the Troy-Deary-Bovill area, the total is now 186, up from last week's 163, and more than

double last year's 80. In the Potlatch area, similar conditions exist as 127 checks are going into that area compared to 115 last week and only 82 a year ago. The Kendrick area's unemployment has increased to 31, up from last week's 28, but nearly double last year's 16. At Genesee, the totals are 13, 13, and 21, reflecting as in Moscow, less unemployment among construction workers this year than last.

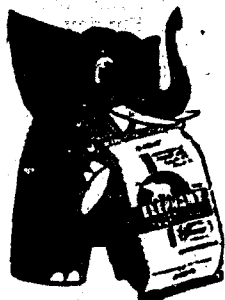

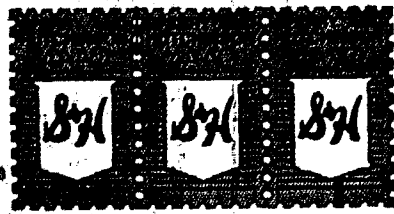
