**Former Genesee, Kendrick Teacher Passes In Orofino**

Kenneth M. Anderson, a former high school teacher at both Genesee and Kendrick, died of an apparent heart attack at his Orofino home on Wednesday morning.

Anderson served in the Army Medical Corps in England during World War II. He enrolled at North Idaho College of Education at Lewiston, receiving his degree in Education in 1947. Later he received his master's degree from the U. of I. at Moscow.

Anderson had been teaching at Orofino High School for the past 20 years as chemistry and physics instructor.

His only immediate survivor is his wife, Christine.

The funeral was held at Vassar-Rawls Funeral home, Lewiston, on Friday with burial at Normal Hill Cemetery. Rev. Charles Mooney, 1st Assembly of God Church pastor officiated.





The District State Deputies, Mr. and Mrs. Edwin Condell also spoke.


Visiting Grange members from Gooding, Evergreen, Troy and Mt. Deary Granges were present.
