Canada Thistle The traditional Canada thistle is now budding and it is time to spray. In only a few days the buds will be in blossom and the seed will be forming.

There are several herbicides commonly used for Canada thistle and morning glory control. The most popular is Abine form of 2, 4-D Heavel and the M. C. P. A. products. Be sure to read the label and follow instructions carefully.

The Idaho State Law requires that noxious weeds be controlled and not allowed to seed.

USA DRY PEA AND LENTIL COUNCIL

Chuck Stegner of Stegner Grain & Seed, Grangeville, was elected Chm. of the USA Dry Pea and Lentil Council at a regular meeting of the Council Trustees in Moscow last week.

Stegner succeeds Bill Stonecipher of Waitesburg as Chm. to direct the foreign marketing efforts of the industry group. Gene Thompson, of Moscow was elected vice-chm., and Dave Robson of Rio Del Mar Foods, San Francisco was chosen secy-treas.

Other members of the council are Hal Roffler of NW Pea & Bean, Spokane and Gerald Miller of Garfield. The 6 trustees represent producers, processors and exporters engaged in production and marketing of dry peas and lentils overseas. With more than 70% of the areas production ending up overseas, the council's role of foreign trade relations continues of importance in spite of certain food shortages in the USA.

Washington, Idaho and Oregon dry peas and lentils are sold to more than 40 countries around the world. Such diversity of export generates ample problems, and it is to work on these problems that prompted creation of the council 10 years ago. Main markets of England, Germany, Venezuela, Brazil, Japan and Taiwan cover 3 continents.

The council works closely with the Washington and Idaho Dry Pea and Lentil Commissions, the two agencies which collect an assessment from growers based on production. Funds of the Commission and also funds obtained from the Pacific Northwest Pea Growers and Dealers Association are used to finance work of the council, to conduct research, public relations and domestic promotion.
