Preparing the small boxes of lids required workers to break down the regular assembly line and reset it for separate packaging," Mrs. Wilson said. She was told the separate packaging of lids by at least 1 company did not begin until April 1st.

I think the companies were unprepared for the unheard number of people who have begun gardening and preserving food."

Before a meter is installed the property owner shall pay to the City Clerk the cost of said meter together with the cost of installation thereof, such charge to be set by the City Council.

SECTION 3. CHARGES AGAIN-ST PROPERTY OWNER. When a meter has been installed, water will er for all water used upon said premises, whether by himself, tenant or otherwise. For the convenience of the property owner, the City shall be allowed to send the water statement to a tenant and accept payment from the tenant on behalf of the property owner. 
