 But alas! they were made for tiny heads, and would surely be

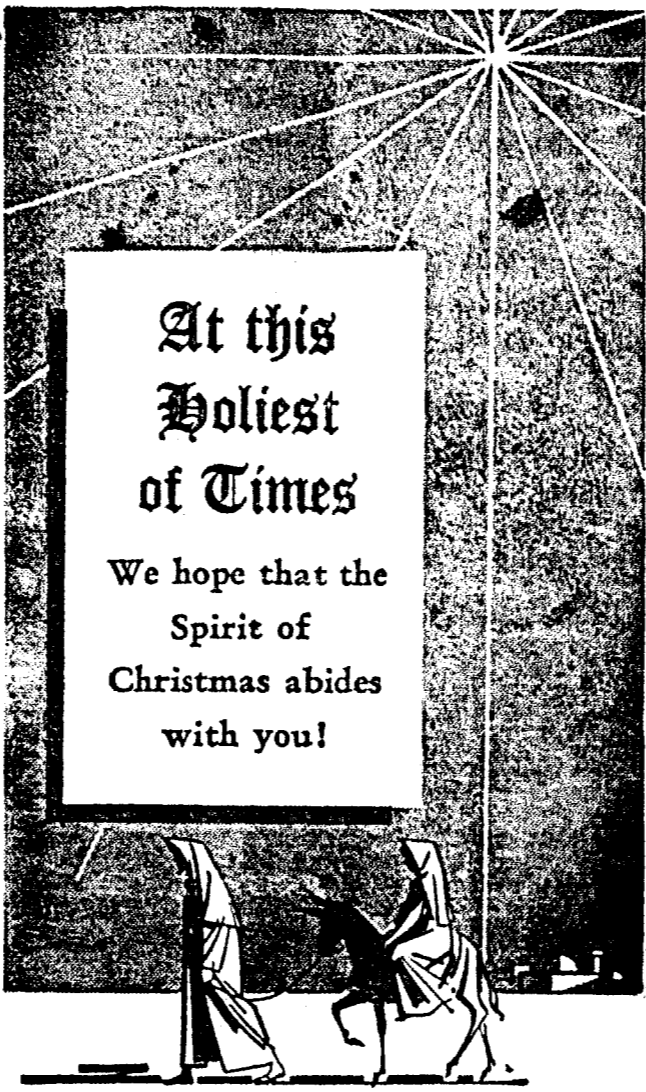
stretched out of shape. By now he'd got to the bottom of the sack—he pulled out the very last one.
