MISCROSCOPIC ORGANISM

Chances are good that any dog or cat is carrying around a miscroscopic organism that can cause a nasty infection is the animal bites someone,

reports the Idaho Medical Assoc. The offender is known to physicians as Pasteurella Multicoda. It is often found in the mouths of healthy dogs and cats and is a common cause of infection following bits or scratches. according to a report in a recent issue of the Journal of the American Medical Association.

A research report based on a 10year study at the Oregon State Public Health laboratory, Portland, notes that some 550,000 domestic animals bites and scratches are reported each year most of them dog bites.

Many of the bites transmit Pasteuella Multicoda. The infection responds well to penicillin and some other antibiotics but it is so common that it is often not diagnosed prompt-

ly according to the study.


